## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to prekindergarten programs provided by public schools,
- 3 including through partnerships with certain community-based
- 4 child-care providers.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 29.1531(b), Education Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) A district that offers a prekindergarten program on a
- 9 tuition basis:
- 10 (1) may not adopt a tuition rate for the program that
- 11 is higher than necessary to cover the added costs of providing the
- 12 program, including any costs associated with collecting,
- 13 reporting, and analyzing data under Section 29.1532(c); [and]
- 14 (2) must submit the proposed tuition rate to the
- 15 commissioner for approval; and
- 16 (3) must demonstrate that the capacity of
- 17 prekindergarten classes provided by existing Head Start or other
- 18 community-based child-care programs located in the district is
- 19 insufficient to meet the needs of the district.
- SECTION 2. Section 29.1532(c), Education Code, is amended
- 21 to read as follows:
- (c) A school district that offers prekindergarten classes
- 23 shall include the following information in the district's Public
- 24 Education Information Management System (PEIMS) report:

- 1 (1) demographic information, as determined by the
- 2 commissioner, on students enrolled in district and campus
- 3 prekindergarten classes, including:
- 4 (A) the number of students who are eligible for
- 5 classes under Section 29.153;
- 6 (B) the number of students enrolled in classes
- 7 provided by Head Start or another community-based child-care
- 8 provider through a partnership with the district; and
- 9 (C) the number of students enrolled in
- 10 prekindergarten classes who are not eligible for prekindergarten
- 11 classes under Section 29.153;
- 12 (2) the numbers of half-day and full-day
- 13 prekindergarten classes offered by the district and campus;
- 14 (3) the number of half-day prekindergarten classes for
- 15 which the district has received an exemption from full-day
- 16 operation under Section 29.153(d);
- 17 (4) the sources of funding for the prekindergarten
- 18 classes;
- 19 (5) the class size and ratio of instructional staff to
- 20 students for each prekindergarten program class offered by the
- 21 district and campus;
- 22 (6) if the district elects to administer an assessment
- 23 instrument under Section 29.169 to students enrolled in district
- 24 and campus prekindergarten program classes, a description and the
- 25 results of each type of assessment instrument; and
- 26 (7) curricula used in the district's prekindergarten
- 27 program classes.

SECTION 3. Section 29.1533, Education Code, is amended to 1 read as follows: 2 Sec. 29.1533. 3 ESTABLISHMENT AND EXPANSION OF [NEW] PROGRAM. Before establishing 4 new 5 prekindergarten program or expanding an existing prekindergarten program, a school district shall solicit and consider proposals for 6 7 partnerships to provide [consider the possibility of sharing use 8 of an existing Head Start or other child-care program site as a] prekindergarten classes with community-based child-care providers 9 who meet the requirements of Section 29.153(g) in a manner that 10 allows the child to enroll in both the school district and the 11 12 program provided by the community-based child-care provider [site]. 13 SECTION 4. Section 29.154, Education Code, is amended to 14 15 read as follows: 16 Sec. 29.154. EVALUATION OF PREKINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS. commissioner of education, in consultation with the executive 17 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission and the 18 19 commissioners of the Texas Workforce Commission [human services], shall monitor and <u>annually</u> evaluate prekindergarten programs as to 20 their developmental appropriateness. The commissioners shall also 21 evaluate the potential for coordination on a statewide basis of 22 23 prekindergarten programs with community-based [government-funded] 24 early childhood care and education programs such as child care administered under Chapter 44, Human Resources Code, and federal 25

Head Start programs. [That evaluation shall use recommendations

contained in the report to the 71st Legislature required by Chapter

- 717, Acts of the 70th Legislature, Regular Session, 1987. For the 1 purpose of providing cost-effective care for children during the 2 full workday with developmentally appropriate curriculum, the commissioners shall investigate the use of existing child-care 4 program sites as prekindergarten sites. Following the evaluation 5 required by this section, the commissioners, in cooperation with 6 school districts and other program administrators, shall integrate 7 8 staff, and program sites for prekindergarten, child-care, and federal Head Start programs to the greatest extent 9
- SECTION 5. Section 29.168(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows:
- The agency shall collaborate with other state agencies, 13 14 including the Health and Human Services Commission, that provide 15 services for children from birth through five years of age to establish prioritized family engagement strategies to be included 16 17 in a school district's family engagement plan. A parent-teacher organization, community group, or faith-based institution may 18 19 submit to the agency recommendations regarding the establishment of family engagement strategies, and the agency, in establishing the 20 21 family engagement strategies, shall consider any received recommendations. The engagement strategies must: 22
- 23 (1) be based on empirical research;

- (2) be proven to demonstrate significant positive short-term and long-term outcomes for early childhood education; [and]
- 27 (3) include programs and interventions that engage a

- 1 family in supporting a student's learning at home; and
- 2 (4) include strategies for collaborating with Head
- 3 Start and other community-based child-care programs.
- 4 SECTION 6. Section 29.169(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (a) A school district shall:
- 7 (1) select and implement appropriate methods for
- 8 evaluating the district's program classes by measuring student
- 9 progress; [and]
- 10 (2) make data from the results of program evaluations
- 11 available to parents; and
- 12 (3) include in evaluating the district's program:
- 13 (A) an analysis of Head Start and other
- 14 community-based child-care programs in the community with which the
- 15 district could establish partnerships; and
- 16 (B) strategies identified for collaborating and
- 17 partnering with Head Start and other community-based child-care
- 18 programs to provide more options for early learning and improve
- 19 kindergarten readiness.
- SECTION 7. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 21 school year.
- 22 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
