1	AN ACT
2	relating to a program to serve students who's safety at school is in
3	jeopardy.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 48, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter J to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER J. SAFETY PROTECTION GRANT PROGRAM
8	Sec. 48.600. AVOIDANCE CHOICE. Notwithstanding any other
9	provision of this code, as provided by this subchapter an eligible
10	student may attend a public school in the district in which the
11	student resides or may use a safety protection grant to attend
12	another district, or accredited private school chosen by the
13	student's parent.

- 14 Sec. 48.601. ELIGIBILITY.
- A student is eligible to receive a safety protection grant to 15 attend another school if the student's parents determine that the 16
- student's safety is in jeopardy. 17
- Sec. 48.602. FINANCING. (a) A student who under this 18
- subchapter uses a safety protection grant to attend a public school 19
- in a school district other than the district in which the student 20
- 21 resides is included in the average daily attendance of the district
- 22 in which the student attends school.
- (b) A school district is entitled to the allotment provided 23
- by Section 48.107 for each eligible student using a safety 24

- 1 protection grant. If the district has a local revenue level greater
- 2 than the guaranteed local revenue level but less than the level
- 3 established under Section 48.257, a school district is entitled
- 4 under rules adopted by the commissioner to additional state aid in
- 5 an amount equal to the difference between the cost to the district
- 6 of providing services to a student using a public education grant
- 7 and the sum of the state aid received because of the allotment under
- 8 Section 48.107 and money from the available school fund
- 9 attributable to the student.
- 10 <u>(c) A school district is entitled to additional facilities</u>
- 11 assistance under Section 48.301 if the district agrees to:
- 12 (1) accept a number of students using safety
- 13 protection grants that is at least one percent of the district's
- 14 average daily attendance for the preceding school year; and
- 15 (2) provide services to each student until the student
- 16 either voluntarily decides to attend a different school or
- 17 graduates from high school.
- 18 (d) If a parent selects a private school, then funding shall
- 19 be calculated as the lesser of the following;
- 20 <u>(1) The amount of funding as calculated under 29.203,</u>
- 21 <u>or;</u>
- 22 (2) the actual amount of tuition charged by the
- 23 school.
- 24 (e) A school district chosen by a student's parent under
- 25 Section 29.201 is entitled to accept or reject the application for
- 26 the student to attend school in that district.
- 27 (f) A school district chosen by a student's parent under

- 1 Section 29.201 may not charge the student tuition.
- 2 Sec. 48.603. ACCREDITED PRIVATE SCHOOLS (a) The
- 3 commissioner shall adopt rules to implement the program including
- 4 the calculation of funding for private school participation. Rules
- 5 shall be designed to prohibit fraud and abuse. The rules may not in
- 6 any form effect or attempt to control the programs, curricula, or
- 7 other operations of private schools.
- 8 (a) The comptroller shall establish the safety protection
- 9 account in the state treasury.
- 10 (b) No federal funds or Available School Funds shall be used
- 11 to fund programs under this subsection.
- 12 Sec. 48.604. SAFETY PROTECTION ACCOUNT. (a) The safety
- 13 protection account is established in the foundation school fund and
- 14 is administered by the comptroller.
- 15 (b) The account consists of:
- 16 (1) money transferred to the credit of the account
- 17 under Section 48.304, Education Code; and
- 18 (2) other amounts appropriated to the account by the
- 19 legislature.
- (c) Money in the account may be used only to award grants for
- 21 the payment of tuition for enrollment of eligible students at
- 22 qualifying schools in the manner prescribed by Section 48.602 and
- 23 rules adopted by the comptroller.
- 24 (d) Interest and income from the assets of the account shall
- 25 be credited to and deposited in the account.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter G, Chapter 48, Education Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Section 48.304 to read as follows:

- Sec. 48.304. SAFETY PROTECTION GRANT. (a) A person to whom
- 2 the commissioner awards a grant under Subchapter J, Chapter 48.601,
- 3 Education Code, is entitled to receive an amount equal to the amount
- 4 of the grant as provided by that subchapter.
- 5 (b) The agency shall transfer to the credit of the safety
- 6 protection account established under Section 48.604, Education
- 7 Code, the amount appropriated to the agency for purposes of this
- 8 section for use by the comptroller in awarding grants as provided by
- 9 Subchapter J, Chapter 48.601, Education Code.
- 10 SECTION 3. The comptroller in cooperation with the
- 11 commissioner shall adopt rules to prohibit fraud and abuse and for
- 12 implementation of this program.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
