A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to an interim study of the appraisal of land used for
- 3 wildlife management for ad valorem tax purposes.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. JOINT INTERIM COMMITTEE ON TAX APPRAISAL OF LAND
- 6 USED FOR WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT. (a) A joint interim committee is
- 7 created to study, review, and report to the legislature on the
- 8 methods and procedures for appraising land used for wildlife
- 9 management for ad valorem tax purposes.
- 10 (b) The joint interim committee is composed of the members
- 11 of the House Ways and Means Committee and the Senate Water,
- 12 Agriculture, and Rural Affairs Committee.
- 13 (c) The chair of the House Ways and Means Committee and the
- 14 chair of the Senate Water, Agriculture, and Rural Affairs Committee
- 15 shall serve as co-chairs of the joint interim committee.
- 16 (d) The joint interim committee shall convene at the joint
- 17 call of the co-chairs.
- 18 (e) The joint interim committee has all other powers and
- 19 duties provided to a special or select committee by the rules of the
- 20 senate and house of representatives, by Subchapter B, Chapter 301,
- 21 Government Code, and by policies of the senate and house committees
- 22 on administration.
- 23 SECTION 2. STUDY. The committee created by this Act shall
- 24 study:

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- 1 (1) the methods and procedures for appraising land
- 2 used for wildlife management for ad valorem taxation under the laws
- 3 of this state;
- 4 (2) the role of the comptroller of public accounts in
- 5 providing guidance to appraisal districts regarding the tax
- 6 appraisal of land used for wildlife management;
- 7 (3) whether the manual relating to the appraisal of
- 8 land used for wildlife management published by the comptroller of
- 9 public accounts should be updated;
- 10 (4) whether additional training on appraising of land
- 11 used for wildlife management for taxation should be provided to
- 12 each chief appraiser of an appraisal district;
- 13 (5) whether the legislature should enact laws to
- 14 provide additional special valuation, exemption, or other
- 15 beneficial ad valorem tax treatment for the owners of land used for
- 16 wildlife management;
- 17 (6) whether the statewide formulas used for appraising
- 18 land used for wildlife management should be updated to produce more
- 19 accurate appraisals;
- 20 (7) whether owners of land used for wildlife
- 21 management should be required to complete a survey on their land
- 22 management and wildlife management practices; and
- 23 (8) how to best clarify the appraisal protest process
- 24 for property owners of land used for wildlife management, including
- 25 the role and duties of appraisal review boards.
- 26 SECTION 3. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS. Not later than
- 27 December 22, 2024, the committee created by this Act shall report

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- 1 the committee's findings and recommendations to the lieutenant
- 2 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the
- 3 governor.
- 4 SECTION 4. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2025.
- 5 SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 6 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 7 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 8 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 9 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
