A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the creation of an interim committee to study large-scale battery storage. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. DEFINITION. In this Act, "large-scale battery 5 storage" includes: 6 7 (1) utility-scale or grid-scale storage of electric energy using batteries for connection to electric power generation 8 9 or transmission and distribution networks to provide for flexibility in electric power systems and optimal use of electric 10 11 energy resources; 12 (2) storage of electric energy using batteries to provide electric power to large industrial, office, or other 13 14 facilities or to residential communities; and (3) electric energy storage using equipment 15 or facilities described by Subchapter E, Chapter 35, Utilities Code, 16 to the extent the facilities employ battery technology. 17 SECTION 2. INTERIM COMMITTEE; STUDY AND REPORT. 18 (a) An interim committee is established to study large-scale battery 19 20 storage. 21 (b) The study must consider: 22 (1) current statutes, regulations, and ordinances 23 regarding large-scale battery storage in this state; 24 (2) the status of state oversight and regulation of

1 large-scale battery storage, including by the Public Utility
2 Commission of Texas, the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality,
3 the Texas Division of Emergency Management, and other state
4 agencies;

5 (3) fire safety standards for large-scale battery 6 storage; and

7 (4) building code standards for large-scale battery8 storage.

9 (c) The interim committee shall be composed of members 10 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives. The 11 members must include:

12 (1) members of the house of representatives;

13 (2) two individuals to represent the large-scale 14 battery storage industry; and

(3) two members of the general public.

16 (d) The speaker of the house of representatives shall 17 designate a member of the interim committee to serve as the chair of 18 the committee.

(e) The interim committee has all other powers and duties
provided to a special committee by the rules of the house of
representatives, by Subchapter B, Chapter 301, Government Code, and
by policies of the House Committee on Administration.

Not later than January 1, 2025, the joint interim 23 (f) 24 committee shall report the committee's findings and 25 recommendations to the governor and the members of the legislature. 26 The report must include recommendations for best practices to 27 address public safety concerns regarding the location and operation

2 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION; ABOLITION OF COMMITTEE. The interim 3 committee established by Section 2 of this Act is abolished and this 4 Act expires January 10, 2025.

5 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 6 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 7 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 8 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 9 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
