- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. On September 1, 2023:
- 7 (1) the administration of the State Office of the
- 8 Rural Health is transferred from the Office of Rural Affairs under
- 9 the Texas Department of Agriculture to the Department of State
- 10 Health Services;
- 11 (2) all rules, policies, procedures, and decisions of
- 12 the Office of Rural Affairs or the Department of Agriculture
- 13 relating to the administration of the State Office of Rural Health
- 14 are continued in effect as rules, policies, procedures, and
- 15 decisions of the office until superseded by a rule or other
- 16 appropriate action by Department of State Health Services; and
- 17 (3) a reference in law or administrative rule to the
- 18 Department of Agriculture or State Office of Rural Affairs relating
- 19 to the administration of the State Office of Rural Affairs means
- 20 Department of State Health Services.
- 21 SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 12, Health and Safety
- 22 Code, is amended by adding Section 12.021 to read as follows:
- 23 Sec. 12.021. STATE OFFICE OF RURAL HEALTH. The department
- 24 shall ensure that the office qualifies as the state's office of

- 1 rural health for the purpose of receiving grants from the Office of
- 2 Rural Health Policy of the United States Department of Health and
- 3 Human Services under 42 U.S.C. Section 254r.
- 4 SECTION 3. Subdivision 487.051(9), Government Code, is
- 5 repealed.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
