7	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
8	Subchapter N to read as follows:

10	Sec. 61.751. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "program"
11	means the Texas Leadership Scholars Program established under this
12	subchapter.
13	Sec. 61.752. INITIATIVE: ESTABLISHMENT; ADMINISTRATION;
14	PURPOSE.
15	(a) The Texas Leadership Scholars Program is established.
16	(b) The board shall establish and administer, using funds
17	appropriated or otherwise available for the purpose, scholarships
18	for high-achieving, low-income students, and academic achievement
19	support and leadership development for student awarded program

(c) To qualify for a scholarship under this section, a

(1) be eligible for automatic admission in a general

- Sec. 61.753. GRANTS, GIFTS, AND DONATIONS. The board may
- 18 solicit, accept, and spend grants, gifts, and donations from any
- 19 public or private source for the purposes of this subchapter.
- Sec. 61.754. RULES. The board shall adopt rules for the
- 21 <u>administration of this subchapter, including rules providing for</u>
- 22 the determination of scholarship amount, student scholarship
- 23 eligibility, satisfactory academic progress criteria, and program
- 24 <u>administration</u>.
- 25 SECTION 2. (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 26 Board shall adopt rules to administer Subchapter N, Chapter 61,
- 27 Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after

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- 1 the effective date of this Act.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
