4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 28.0022, Education Code, is amended by
6	adding Subsections (h) and (i) to read as follows:
7	(h) Nothing in this section may be construed as limiting a
8	teacher, administrator, or other employee of a state agency, school
9	district, or open-enrollment charter school from:
10	(1) implementing a strategy to prevent or mediate
11	either specific instances or cultures of bullying or harassment
12	that occur due to the victim's actual or perceived race, ethnicity,
13	color, national origin, sex, gender, religion, disability status,
14	or association with a person or group with one or more of those
15	actual or perceived characteristics, including a strategy
16	implemented pursuant to a policy adopted under Section 37.0832; or
17	(2) training teachers, administrators, or other
18	employees in the implementation of a strategy described by
19	Subdivision (1), including by providing staff development under
20	<u>Section 21.451.</u>
21	(i) In this section:
22	(1) "Bullying" has the meaning assigned by Section
23	<u>37.0832.</u>

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(2) "Harassment" has the meaning assigned by Section

- 3 harassment that occurs due to the victim's:
- 4 (A) actual or perceived race, ethnicity, color,
- 5 <u>national origin, sex, gender, religion, or disability status; or</u>
- 6 (B) association with a person or group with one
- 7 or more of the actual or perceived characteristics listed in
- 8 Paragraph (A).
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 37.0832, Education Code, is amended by
- 10 adding Subsections (b), (b-1), (b-2), and (f) and amending
- 11 Subsections (c), (c-1), (d), and (e).
- (b) [(c)] The board of trustees of each school district
- 13 shall adopt a policy, including any necessary procedures,
- 14 concerning bullying that:
- 15 (1) prohibits the bullying of a student;
- 16 (2) prevents and mediates bullying incidents between
- 17 students that:
- 18 (A) interfere with a student's educational
- 19 opportunities; or
- 20 (B) substantially disrupt the orderly operation
- 21 of a classroom, school, or school-sponsored or school-related
- 22 activity;
- 23 (3) prohibits retaliation against any person,
- 24 including a victim, a witness, or another person, who in good faith
- 25 provides information concerning an incident of bullying;
- 26 (4) requires a school district employee who, in the
- 27 course and scope of employment, witnesses or receives information

- 1 regarding an incident that the employee reasonably believes
- 2 constitutes bullying by or against a student who at the time of the
- 3 incident is enrolled in the district at which the employee is
- 4 employed to report the information to a campus behavior coordinator
- 5 or other appropriate district official;
- (5) [(4)] establishes a procedure for providing notice
- 7 of an incident of bullying to:
- 8 (A) a parent or guardian of the alleged victim on
- 9 or before the third business day after the date the incident is
- 10 reported; and
- 11 (B) a parent or guardian of the <u>student</u> alleged
- 12 to have engaged in bullying [bully] within a reasonable amount of
- 13 time after the incident;
- (6) $\left[\frac{(5)}{(5)}\right]$ establishes the actions a student should
- 15 take to obtain assistance and intervention in response to bullying;
- 16 (7) [(6)] sets out the supportive measures provided by
- 17 the district under Subsection (b-1) and available to [available
- 18 counseling options for a student who is impacted by bullying,
- 19 <u>including the alleged</u> [a] victim of <u>bullying</u>, a person who
- 20 <u>allegedly engaged in bullying</u>, or a witness to bullying [or who
- 21 engages in bullying];
- (8) (8) (8) establishes procedures for reporting an
- 23 incident of bullying, including procedures for a student to
- 24 anonymously report an incident of bullying;
- (9) establishes procedures for $[\tau]$ investigating a
- 26 reported incident of bullying, and determining whether the reported
- 27 incident of bullying occurred, which must include requiring:

1	(A) written notice of the investigation or a
2	reported incident of bullying to all students impacted by the
3	incident and the parents or legal guardians of those students;
4	(B) the provision of supportive measures under
5	Subsection (b-1) to students impacted by the incident throughout
6	the investigation;
7	(C) the issuance of an investigative report that
8	includes the identity of witnesses to the incident, a summary of
9	evidence considered, the investigator's determination as to
10	whether the reported incident occurred and, if so, the student or
11	students responsible for the incident, and the rationale for those
12	determinations;
13	(D) an opportunity for each impacted student and
14	that student's parent or legal guardian to review and comment on the
15	investigative report required under Paragraph (C) prior to the
16	report being finalized; and
17	(E) an opportunity for each impacted student to
18	appeal a determination of the investigator;
19	(10) requires investigations conducted pursuant to
20	the procedures established under Subdivision (9) to be completed
21	not later than the 10th business day after the district receives a
22	report of bullying submitted pursuant to the procedures established
23	under Subdivision (8), unless the time period is extended for good
24	cause and a written notice of the extension and rationale is
25	provided to impacted students and those students' parents or legal
26	guardians;
27	(11) [(8)] prohibits the imposition of a disciplinary

- 1 measure on a student who, after an investigation, is found to be a
- 2 victim of bullying, on the basis of that student's use of reasonable
- 3 self-defense in response to the bullying;
- 4 (12) [(9)] requires that discipline for bullying of a
- 5 student with disabilities comply with applicable requirements
- 6 under federal law, including the Individuals with Disabilities
- 7 Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1400 et seq.); and
- 8 (13) (10) complies with the minimum standards adopted
- 9 by the agency under Subsection (c) $[\frac{(c-1)}{c}]$.
- 10 (b-1) The board of trustees of each school district shall
- 11 provide to a student impacted by bullying supportive measures that
- 12 are not disciplinary or punitive and are individualized to the
- 13 student. Measures provided under this subsection shall be designed
- 14 to:
- 15 (1) protect the safety of all students, teachers, and
- 16 other school staff in the district; and
- 17 (2) ensure a student impacted by bullying has
- 18 continued access to the school's educational program, including the
- 19 student's normal instructional lessons and activities, and may
- 20 include:
- 21 (A) counseling;
- (B) the extension of a deadline for turning in
- 23 <u>coursework or other instruction-related adjustments;</u>
- 24 (C) modifications to a class schedule;
- (D) requiring an employee of the district to
- 26 escort a student while the student is on a district campus;
- 27 (E) a transfer under Section 25.0342;

- (F) restrictions on contact between students 1 2
- impacted by an incident of bullying; and
- (G) other <u>similar measures</u>. 3
- 4 (b-2) A school district must provide supportive measures
- 5 under Subsection (b-1):
- 6 (1) without fee or charge; and
- (2) regardless of whether the student elects to 7
- cooperate with an investigation conducted pursuant to the 8
- procedures established under Subsection (b)(9). 9
- 10 (c) [(c-1)] The agency shall adopt minimum standards for a
- school district's policy under Subsection (b) [(c)]. The standards 11
- 12 must:
- (1)include an emphasis on bullying prevention by 13
- focusing on school climate, [and] building healthy relationships 14
- 15 between students and staff, and engaging in dialogue to create a
- culture of understanding and respect; 16
- 17 (2) require each district campus to establish a
- committee to address bullying by focusing on prevention efforts and 18
- health and wellness initiatives; 19
- 20 (3) require students at each grade level to meet
- periodically for instruction on building relationships and 21
- preventing bullying, including cyberbullying and identity-based 22
- 23 bullying;
- 24 (4)include an emphasis on increasing student
- 25 reporting of bullying incidents to school employees by:
- 26 (A) increasing awareness about district
- 27 reporting procedures; and

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- 1 (B) providing for anonymous reporting of
- 2 bullying incidents;
- 3 (5) require districts to:
- 4 (A) collect information annually through student
- 5 surveys on bullying, including cyberbullying and identity-based
- 6 bullying; and
- 7 (B) use those survey results to develop action
- 8 plans to address student concerns regarding bullying, including
- 9 cyberbullying and identity-based bullying; and
- 10 (6) require districts to develop a rubric or checklist
- 11 to assess an incident of bullying and to determine the district's
- 12 response to the incident.
- 13 (d) The policy and any necessary procedures adopted under
- 14 Subsection (b) [(c)] must be included:
- 15 (1) annually, in the student and employee school
- 16 district handbooks; and
- 17 (2) in the district improvement plan under Section
- 18 11.252.
- 19 (e) The procedure for reporting bullying established under
- 20 Subsection (b) [(c)] must be posted on the district's Internet
- 21 website to the extent practicable.
- 22 (f) The board of trustees of each school district shall
- 23 annually publish a written summary of all incidents of bullying
- 24 reported at each campus within the district. The summary must be
- 25 posted on the district's Internet website and sent to all parents
- 26 and legal guardians of students enrolled in the district at the
- 27 beginning of each school year and:

- 1 (1) may not identify any person; and 2 (2) must include: 3 (A) the number of reported incidents of bullying at each district campus, including the number of reported incidents 4 5 of cyberbullying and identity-based bullying; 6 (B) the number of investigations conducted as a 7 result of reported incidents of bullying; (C) the disposition, if applicable, of any 8 disciplinary processes arising from the reported incidents of 9 bullying, including a summary of the nature of an incident that 10 resulted in a disciplinary process, the rationale behind the 11 12 determination of responsibility, if applicable, and disciplinary measure imposed; and 13 14 (D) the number of reports for which the district 15 determined not to initiate an investigation or impose disciplinary measures and the reasons for each determination. 16 17 SECTION 4. Section 48.009(b-4), Education Code, as added by Chapter 972 (S.B. 2050), Acts of the 87th Legislature, Regular 18 Session, 2021, is amended to read as follows: 19 (b-4) The commissioner by rule shall require each school 20 21 district and open-enrollment charter school to annually report through the Public Education Information Management System the 22 23 number of reported incidents of bullying that have occurred at each

- 4 SECTION 6. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 5 school year.
- 6 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
