## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 531.024172, Government Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsections (g), (g-1), and (g-2) to read as follows:
- 7 (g) The commission may recognize <u>an alternative</u> [a health
- 8 care provider's proprietary | electronic visit verification system,
- 9 including a system [whether] purchased or developed by a health
- 10 care [the] provider, as complying with this section and allow a
- 11 [the] health care provider to use an alternative electronic visit

- 19 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a

- 21 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 22 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 23 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
