4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 29, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter K-1 to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER K-1. OPPORTUNITY HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA PILOT PROGRAM
8	Sec. 29.405. PURPOSE. It is the intent of the legislature
9	to study alternative means by which an adult student who enrolls in
10	a workforce education program at a public junior college and who has

previously dropped out of secondary education may earn a high

- 13 competency-based educational program that enables the student to
- demonstrate knowledge substantially equivalent to what is required 14
- for a Foundation High School Diploma. The Texas Higher Education 15
- Coordinating Board shall consult with the Texas Education Agency 16
- and Texas Workforce Commission during the development and 17
- 18 implementation of this pilot program.
- 19 Sec. 29.406. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- (1) "Opportunity High School Diploma" means a diploma 20
- 21 awarded by a public junior college approved by the Texas Higher
- 22 Education Coordinating Board under this subchapter.
- (2) "Board" means the Texas Higher Education Coordinating 23
- 24 Board.

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- 1 (3) "Eligible student" means any student age 18 or older who
- 2 has been, or would have been, recorded as a dropout in the Texas
- 3 public education system or has not otherwise earned a GED or diploma
- 4 from a Texas public school or through any other secondary
- 5 education.
- 6 (4) "Participating institution" means a public junior
- 7 college authorized by the board, either alone or as part of a
- 8 consortium of institutions, to offer a program under this
- 9 subchapter.
- 10 (5) "Substantially equivalent" means the provision by a
- 11 participating institution of higher education of any combination of
- 12 instruction, curriculum, achievement, internship opportunities, or
- 13 other means by which the board determines that an educational
- 14 program under this subchapter may appropriately certify that a
- 15 student has attained levels of knowledge sufficient to adequately
- 16 prepare a student for postsecondary education or additional
- 17 workforce education.
- 18 Sec. 29.407. OPPORTUNITY HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA. (a) The
- 19 board may approve not more than five public junior colleges to
- 20 participate as lead institutions for a pilot program to offer an
- 21 alternative competency-based high school diploma program for adult
- 22 learners.
- 23 (b) The board shall review and approve a proposed program
- 24 requested by a public junior college, if the board determines that
- 25 the public junior college's proposed program will provide
- 26 instruction and assessments appropriate to certify that a student
- 27 can demonstrate levels of knowledge sufficient to adequately

- 1 prepare a student for postsecondary education or additional
- 2 workforce education.
- 3 (c) Each approved public junior college program shall
- 4 concurrently enroll an eligible student in a workforce education
- 5 program and the Opportunity High School Diploma program to allow
- 6 the student to earn a high school diploma while completing a
- 7 postsecondary certificate or degree.
- 8 <u>(d) Each approved public junior college program shall</u>
- 9 administer assessments as prescribed by Board rule prior to award
- 10 of an Opportunity High School Diploma.
- 11 (e) A diploma under this section shall be considered
- 12 equivalent to a Foundation High School Diploma.
- Sec. 29.408. APPROVAL. (a) The board may approve not more
- 14 than five public junior college programs to offer the Opportunity
- 15 High School Diploma under this subchapter.
- (b) A public junior college that submits a proposed program
- 17 under this subchapter may enter into an agreement with one or more
- 18 public junior colleges, general academic teaching institutions,
- 19 public school districts, or nonprofit organizations to offer a
- 20 program.
- 21 (c) Upon board approval, a public junior college or colleges
- 22 may offer an approved program at any campus of the applicant or
- 23 partnering institution.
- Sec. 29.409. FUNDING. (a) The Texas Workforce Commission
- 25 and the board shall work jointly to identify funding mechanisms,
- 26 including grants, interagency contracts, financial aid, or
- 27 subsidies available to public junior colleges and students to

- 1 encourage and facilitate adult dropouts in earning the Opportunity
- 2 High School Diploma.
- 3 (b) A public junior college that offers an Opportunity High
- 4 School Diploma under this subchapter shall be entitled to funding
- 5 in the community college finance system, as determined by the
- 6 board.
- 7 Sec. 29.410. RULE MAKING AND IMPLEMENTATION. (a) The board
- 8 shall adopt rules to implement this subchapter as necessary.
- 9 (b) The board may coordinate with the Texas Education Agency
- 10 as necessary to determine whether a proposed program offering an
- 11 Opportunity High School Diploma is sufficient to adequately prepare
- 12 a student for postsecondary education or additional workforce
- 13 education.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 130, Education Code, is amended by
- 15 adding Section 130.0082 to read as follows:
- 16 Sec. 130.0082. PILOT PROGRAM FOR HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS FOR
- 17 RECOVERED DROPOUTS IN PUBLIC JUNIOR COLLEGES. A public junior
- 18 college may apply to the board to offer an Opportunity High School
- 19 Diploma program in accordance with subchapter K-1, Chapter 29,
- 20 Texas Education Code.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
