A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to a study of the financing of regional facilities that

- 3 convert groundwater to surface water.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Board" means the Texas Water Development Board.
- 7 (2) "Facility" means a regional water facility that
- 8 converts groundwater to surface water.
- 9 SECTION 2. WORKING GROUP. (a) A working group composed of
- 10 representatives of the Texas Water Development Board and the Texas
- 11 Public Finance Authority is formed to study, review, and report to
- 12 the legislature on the methods used to finance or refinance
- 13 regional water facilities that convert groundwater to surface
- 14 water.
- 15 (b) The working group may include representatives of local
- 16 governments of Harris and Fort Bend Counties that have borrowed
- 17 money from the board for a facility.
- 18 (c) The chair of the board, or a designee of the chair of the
- 19 board, shall serve as the chair of the working group.
- 20 (d) The working group shall convene at the call of the
- 21 chair.
- 22 SECTION 3. STUDY. The working group shall study:
- 23 (1) the useful life of regional water facilities that
- 24 convert groundwater to surface water, including associated

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- 1 improvements during a facility's useful life;
- 2 (2) the typical period of time necessary to pay the
- 3 costs associated with developing a financed facility;
- 4 (3) the economic effect on current water users paying
- 5 the cost of a facility that will provide service to future water
- 6 users;
- 7 (4) the financing terms of current and anticipated
- 8 facilities;
- 9 (5) the ability to distribute the costs associated
- 10 with the development of a facility to the users who benefit from the
- 11 facility, including:
- 12 (A) the fairness and equity benefits to water
- 13 users of extending the financing of a facility compared to the
- 14 potential increase in financing costs associated with an extension
- 15 of financing;
- 16 (B) the ability to use methods of financing or
- 17 refinancing to accomplish this distribution;
- 18 (C) policies and procedures of this state and the
- 19 board that may be used to accomplish this distribution;
- (D) whether the board's financing terms and
- 21 conditions can be improved to better accomplish this distribution,
- 22 including whether the board may forgive a loan or a portion of a
- 23 loan to better accomplish this distribution;
- 24 (E) whether potential measures that could
- 25 accomplish this distribution are precluded by state law; and
- 26 (F) what changes to state law may be necessary to
- 27 accomplish this distribution;

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- 1 (6) whether financial assistance administered by the
- 2 board may be used to refinance or restructure existing financing of
- 3 a facility; and
- 4 (7) whether a facility is eligible for grant funding.
- 5 SECTION 4. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS. (a) The working
- 6 group shall recommend any changes and improvements relating to the
- 7 financing of regional facilities that convert groundwater to
- 8 surface water that may be implemented by this state, the board, or
- 9 another state agency without further legislative authorization.
- 10 (b) Not later than September 1, 2024, the working group
- 11 shall report the working group's findings and recommendations to
- 12 the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of
- 13 representatives, and the governor.
- 14 (c) A member of the house or the senate may request to be
- 15 kept informed of the working group's progress throughout the
- 16 duration of the study.
- SECTION 5. EXPIRATION. This Act expires September 1, 2025.
- 18 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 19 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 20 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 21 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 22 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
