A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the eligibility of a school district or open-enrollment
- 3 charter school to receive a grant from the Department of
- 4 Agriculture to provide surplus agricultural products to certain
- 5 students.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 21.001, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 21.001. CREATION. The department by rule shall
- 10 develop a program to award grants to:
- 11 (1) nonprofit organizations for the purpose of
- 12 collecting and distributing surplus agricultural products to food
- 13 banks and other charitable organizations that serve needy or
- 14 low-income individuals; and
- 15 (2) public schools for the purpose of collecting and
- 16 distributing surplus agricultural products to educationally
- 17 <u>disadvantaged students</u>.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 21.002, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 19 read as follows:
- Sec. 21.002. ELIGIBILITY. (a) For the purposes of this
- 21 chapter:
- 22 (1) "Educationally disadvantaged" has the meaning
- 23 <u>assigned by Section 5.001, Education Code.</u>
- 24 (2) "Public school" means a school district or an

- 1 open-enrollment charter school established under Subchapter D,
- 2 Chapter 12, Education Code.
- 3 (b) Subject to available funds:
- 4 $\underline{(1)}$ [$_{m{ au}}$] a nonprofit organization is eligible to
- 5 receive a grant under this chapter if the organization:
- 6 $\underline{\text{(A)}}$ [\frac{(1)}{1}] has at least five years of experience
- 7 coordinating a statewide network of food banks and charitable
- 8 organizations that serve each county of this state;
- 9 (B) $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ operates a program that coordinates
- 10 the collection and transportation of surplus agricultural products
- 11 to a statewide network of food banks that provide food to needy or
- 12 low-income individuals; and
- (C) $[\frac{(3)}{3}]$ submits to the department, in the
- 14 manner and time prescribed by the department, a proposal for the
- 15 collection and distribution to food banks or other charitable
- 16 organizations for use in providing food to needy or low-income
- 17 individuals of surplus agricultural products, including:
- (i) $\left[\frac{A}{A}\right]$ a description of the proposal;
- 19 (ii) [(B)] a schedule of projected costs
- 20 for the proposal;
- $\underline{\text{(iii)}}$ [(C)] measurable goals for the
- 22 proposal; and
- $\underline{\text{(iv)}}$ [\(\frac{\text{(iv)}}{D}\)] a plan for evaluating the
- 24 success of the proposal; and
- 25 (2) a public school is eligible to receive a grant
- 26 under this chapter if the school submits to the department, in the
- 27 manner and time prescribed by the department, a proposal for the

- 1 collection and distribution of surplus agricultural products to
- 2 educationally disadvantaged students that includes the information
- 3 required to be provided under Subdivisions (1)(C)(i)-(iv).
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 21.003, Agriculture Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 21.003. REPORT. A nonprofit organization or public
- 7 school that receives a grant under this chapter must report the
- 8 results of the project to the department in the manner prescribed by
- 9 the department.
- SECTION 4. Section 33.907, Education Code, is amended by
- 11 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (e-1) to read as
- 12 follows:
- 13 (a) In this section:
- 14 (1) "Donate" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 15 76.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
- 16 (2) "Educationally disadvantaged" has the meaning
- 17 assigned by Section 5.001.
- 18 (3) "Nonprofit organization" has the meaning assigned
- 19 by Section 76.001, Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
- 20 (e-1) A school district or open-enrollment charter school
- 21 may:
- 22 (1) adopt a policy allowing a campus in the district or
- 23 school to collect surplus agricultural products that are eligible
- 24 for donation under Subsection (b) and donate the products to the
- 25 families of educationally disadvantaged students enrolled at the
- 26 campus; and
- 27 (2) apply to receive a grant under the grant program

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- 1 established under Chapter 21, Agriculture Code, for a campus that
- 2 makes the election under Subdivision (1).
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act applies beginning with the 2023-2024
- 4 school year.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
