4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 33, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 33.915 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 33.915. COMMUNITY-BASED LEARNING CENTERS. (a) In
8	this section, "center" means a community-based learning center
9	established under Subsection (b).
10	(b) The agency shall establish, in collaboration with
11	faith-based nonprofit organizations, a program for the development
12	and operation of community-based learning centers in various school
13	districts to provide students who qualify for compensatory
14	education, as determined by the commissioner, with access to:
15	(1) technology;
16	(2) tutoring services;
17	(3) mentoring services;
18	(4) social and emotional support;
19	(5) outdoor activities;
20	(6) art;
21	(7) sports; and
22	(8) individually designed services and supports that
23	may include treatment services, personal support services, or any
24	other support necessary to improve academic and social outcomes for

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1	a student, as determined by a center.
2	(c) The agency shall adopt minimum training and skills
3	requirements that each individual providing services through the
4	center must satisfy.
5	(d) From funds appropriated for the purpose, the agency
6	shall pay the costs for developing and operating a center. The
7	agency shall actively seek federal grants or funds to pay costs
8	associated with the establishment and operation of each center.
9	(e) The agency by rule shall establish a procedure for
10	distributing funds to a school district or other appropriate entity
11	approved by the agency to establish and operate or contract for the
12	operation of a center.
13	(f) In addition to money appropriated by the legislature,
14	the agency may accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source
15	for establishing the program.
16	(g) The agency may adopt rules as necessary to implement
17	this section, including rules regarding an application process and
18	eligibility criteria to develop and operate a center.
19	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
