- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1701.262(c), Occupations Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (c) The curriculum developed under this section must
- 8 incorporate learning objectives regarding:
- 9 (1) child and adolescent development and psychology;
- 10 (2) positive behavioral interventions and supports,
- 11 conflict resolution techniques, and restorative justice
- 12 techniques;
- 13 (3) de-escalation techniques and techniques for
- 14 limiting the use of force, including the use of physical,
- 15 mechanical, and chemical restraints;
- 16 (4) the mental and behavioral health needs of children
- 17 with disabilities or special needs; [and]
- 18 (5) mental health crisis intervention; and
- 19 <u>(6) the effects of mental health conditions, including</u>
- 20 grief and trauma, on student behavior and the ways in which using
- 21 evidence-based, grief-informed, and trauma-informed strategies
- 22 support a safe school environment and protect the mental health of
- 23 students affected by grief and trauma.
- 24 SECTION 2. As soon as practicable after the effective date

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- 1 of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall amend the
- 2 model training curriculum as necessary to implement Section
- 3 1701.262(c), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
