- 4 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 61, Election Code, is

- 6 Sec. 61.003. ELECTIONEERING AND LOITERING NEAR POLLING
- 7 PLACE. (a) A person commits an offense if, during the voting
- 8 period and within 100 feet of an outside door through which a voter
- 9 may enter the building in which a polling place is located, the
- 10 person:
- 11 (1) loiters; <del>or</del>
- 12 (2) electioneers for or against any candidate,
- 13 measure, or political party-; or
- 14 (3) conducts exit polling.
- 15 (a-1) The entity that owns or controls a public building
- 16 being used as a polling place may not, at any time during the voting
- 17 period, prohibit electioneering on the building's premises outside
- 18 of the area described in Subsection (a), but may enact reasonable
- 19 regulations concerning the time, place, and manner of
- 20 electioneering.
- 21 (b) In this section:
- 22 (1) "Electioneering" includes the posting, use, or
- 23 distribution of political signs or literature. The term does not
- 24 include the distribution of a notice of a party convention

- 3 persons seeking to communicate with voters exiting the voting

- 7 the last voter has voted, whichever is later.
- 8 (c) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
