A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority of the Public Utility Commission of Texas
- 3 to impose administrative penalties and enter into voluntary
- 4 mitigation plans; increasing an administrative penalty.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Sections 15.023(b) and (f), Utilities Code, are
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) The penalty for a violation may be in an amount not to
- 9 exceed \$1,000,000 [$\frac{$25,000}{}$]. Each day a violation continues or
- 10 occurs is a separate violation for purposes of imposing a penalty.
- 11 (f) The commission and a person may develop and enter into a
- 12 voluntary mitigation plan relating to a violation of Section 39.157
- 13 or rules adopted by the commission under that section. The
- 14 voluntary mitigation plan must be updated at least once every two
- 15 years. Not later than the 90th day after the date of a substantial
- 16 wholesale market design change, the commission shall review each
- 17 <u>existing voluntary mitigation plan to determine whether any changes</u>
- 18 to the plan are necessary. A party with a justiciable interest in
- 19 the result of a proceeding to adopt or renew a voluntary mitigation
- 20 plan is entitled to participate in the proceeding. Adherence [If
- 21 the commission and a person enter into a voluntary mitigation plan,
- 22 adherence] to the plan may be considered in determining whether a
- 23 violation occurred and, if so, the penalty to be assessed
- 24 [constitutes an absolute defense against an alleged violation with

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- 1 respect to activities covered by the plan].
- 2 SECTION 2. Section 15.023(b-1), Utilities Code, is
- 3 repealed.
- 4 SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 5 a violation committed on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 6 violation committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 7 governed by the law in effect when the violation was committed, and
- 8 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
