1-19 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
 1-20 AN ACT

1-21 relating to Medicaid coverage and reimbursement for non-opioid
 1-22 treatments.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
 1-25 is amended by adding Section 32.03117 to read as follows:

1-26 Sec. 32.03117. REIMBURSEMENT FOR NON-OPIOID TREATMENTS.

1-27 (a) In this section, "non-opioid treatment" means a drug or
 1-28 biological product that is indicated to produce analgesia without
 1-29 acting on the body's opioid receptors.

1-30 (b) The commission shall ensure that medical assistance
 1-31 reimbursement is provided to a provider who provides a non-opioid
 1-32 treatment to a recipient under the medical assistance program.

1-33 (c) The executive commissioner by rule shall ensure that, to
 1-34 the extent permitted by federal law, a hospital provider that
 1-35 provides outpatient department services to a medical assistance
 1-36 recipient is reimbursed separately under the medical assistance
 1-37 program for any non-opioid treatment provided as a part of those
 1-38 services.

1-39 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
 1-40 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
 1-41 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
 1-42 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
 1-43 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
 1-44 waiver or authorization is granted.

1-45 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.

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
