A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to monetary assistance provided by the Department of
 3 Family and Protective Services to certain parents.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 264, Family Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 264.208 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 264.208. MONITORED RETURN ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. (a) If
- 8 <u>a court has rendered an order under Section 263.403 providing for</u>
- 9 the monitored return of a child to a parent, the department shall
- 10 provide monetary assistance under this section for the duration of
- 11 the monitoring period to a parent who:
- 12 (1) has a family income that is less than or equal to
- 13 300 percent of the federal poverty level; and
- 14 (2) demonstrates to the department that economic
- 15 factors, including unemployment or inability to afford housing,
- 16 transportation, utilities, food, medical care, mental health care,
- 17 or child care are the main barrier to reunification.
- 18 <u>(b) The department shall disburse monetary assistance</u>
- 19 provided to a parent under Subsection (a) in the same manner as the
- 20 department disburses payments to a foster parent, including making
- 21 a rate increase effective on the same date the department
- 22 <u>implements a rate increase for the minimum daily foster care</u>
- 23 reimbursement rate.
- (c) The department, at its discretion and for good cause,

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- 1 may extend the monetary assistance payments for an additional six
- 2 months after the date the case is dismissed to support family
- 3 stability after reunification.
- 4 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to an
- 5 order rendered under Section 263.403, Family Code, regardless of
- 6 whether the order was rendered before, on, or after the effective
- 7 date of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
