## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the reporting method in determining that a dog is
- 3 dangerous.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sec. 822.0421, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) If a person reports an incident described by Section
- 8 822.041(2), the animal control authority may investigate the
- 9 incident. If, after receiving the sworn statements of any
- 10 witnesses, or observing and documenting aggressive behavior by the
- $11 \quad \underline{\text{dog}}$ , the animal control authority determines the dog is a dangerous
- 12 dog, the animal control authority shall notify the owner in writing
- 13 of the determination.
- 14 (b) An affidavit used to secure a sworn statement from a
- 15 witness under 822.0421(a) shall include an option for the witness
- 16 to have their personal information excepted from disclosure
- 17 pursuant to Chapter 552.101 of the Government Code.
- 18 <u>(c)</u> Notwithstanding any other law, including a municipal
- 19 ordinance, an owner, not later than the 15th day after the date the
- 20 owner is notified that a dog owned by the owner is a dangerous dog,
- 21 may appeal the determination of the animal control authority to a
- 22 justice, county, or municipal court of competent jurisdiction.
- 23 (d) To file an appeal under Subsection (b), the owner must:
- 24 (1) file a notice of appeal of the animal control

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- 1 authority's dangerous dog determination with the court;
- 2 (2) attach a copy of the determination from the animal
- 3 control authority; and
- 4 (3) serve a copy of the notice of appeal on the animal
- 5 control authority by mailing the notice through the United States
- 6 Postal Service.
- 7 (e) An owner may appeal the decision of the justice or
- 8 municipal court under Subsection (b) in the manner described by
- 9 Section 822.0424.
- 10 SECTION 2. This act takes effect September 1, 2023.
