- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 122.301(b), Agriculture Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A state agency may [not] authorize a person to
- 8 manufacture a product containing hemp for smoking. For the
- 9 purposes of this subsection, "smoking" means burning or igniting a
- 10 substance and inhaling the smoke or heating a substance and
- 11 inhaling the resulting vapor or aerosol [, as defined by Section
- 12 443.001, Health and Safety Code].
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 443.204, Health and Safety Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 443.204. RULES RELATED TO SALE OF CONSUMABLE HEMP
- 16 PRODUCTS. Rules adopted by the executive commissioner regulating
- 17 the sale of consumable hemp products must to the extent allowable by
- 18 federal law reflect the following principles:
- 19 (1) hemp-derived cannabinoids, including cannabidiol,
- 20 are not considered controlled substances or adulterants;
- 21 (2) products containing one or more hemp-derived
- 22 cannabinoids, such as cannabidiol, intended for ingestion are
- 23 considered foods, not controlled substances or adulterated
- 24 products; and

- 1 (3) consumable hemp products must be packaged and
- 2 labeled in the manner provided by Section 443.205 [; and
- 3 [(4) the processing or manufacturing of a consumable
- 4 hemp product for smoking is prohibited].
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 443.001(11), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 repealed.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
