A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the creation, management, and administration of the
3	Texas Pharmaceutical Initiative.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 10, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 2177 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 2177. TEXAS PHARMACEUTICAL INITIATIVE
8	Sec. 2177.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Initiative" means the Texas Pharmaceutical
10	Initiative established in Sec. 2177.002.
11	(2) "Board" means the governing board established in
12	Sec. 2177.003.
13	Sec. 2177.002. TEXAS PHARMACEUTICAL INITIATIVE;
14	ESTABLISHMENT. The Texas Pharmaceutical Initiative is established
15	to provide cost effective prescription drug access for employees,
16	dependents, and retirees of public higher education systems and
17	institutions, Employees Retirement System of Texas members,
18	Teacher Retirement System of Texas members, persons confined by the
19	Texas Department of Criminal Justice or the Texas Juvenile Justice
20	Department, recipients of medical assistance, enrollees of the
21	child health plan program, and other public, non-profit, and
22	for-profit entities.
23	Sec. 2177.003. GOVERNING BOARD. (a) The initiative shall

be governed by a board that consists of:

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1	(1) the commissioner of the Texas Health and Human
2	Services Commission, or their designee;
3	(2) the executive director of the Employees Retirement
4	System of Texas, or their designee;
5	(3) the executive director of the Teacher Retirement
6	System of Texas, or their designee;
7	(4) three members appointed by the governor;
8	(5) one member appointed by the governor from a list of
9	three names submitted by the lieutenant governor;
10	(6) one member appointed by the governor from a list of
11	three names submitted by the speaker of the house of
12	representatives; and
13	(6) the chancellor of the University of Texas System,
14	or the chancellor's designee, in an ex-officio capacity.
15	(b) A vacancy on the board shall be filled in the same manner
16	as the original appointment.
17	(c) The board is administratively attached to the Health and
18	Human Services Commission.
19	(d) The governor shall select the presiding officer of the
20	board.
21	Sec. 2177.004. GENERAL DUTIES. (a) The board established
22	under SECTION 2177.003 shall:
23	(1) develop and implement the initiative and related
24	programs established in this chapter;
25	(2) establish procedures and policies for the

(3) establish procedures to document compliance by

administration of the board;

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- 1 board members and staff with applicable laws governing conflicts of
- 2 interest; and
- 3 (4) adopt all necessary rules to implement this
- 4 chapter.
- 5 (b) The board may:
- 6 (1) execute all contracts and other documents, adopt
- 7 all proceedings, and conduct all activities determined by the board
- 8 to be necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter. The
- 9 board may authorize one or more members of the board to execute
- 10 contracts and other documents on behalf of the board; and
- 11 (2) establish and create any committees or other
- 12 entities the board may deem necessary to exercise the powers
- 13 provided in this act. The board may delegate to such committees or
- 14 other entities administrative duties and other powers as the board
- 15 may deem necessary;
- 16 (3) hire a chief executive officer and employ
- 17 necessary staff to provide administrative support;
- 18 (4) make grants to provide funds to public or private
- 19 persons to implement the Texas Pharmaceutical Initiative.
- 20 (c) the board is required to implement a provision of this
- 21 chapter only if the legislature appropriates money specifically for
- 22 that purpose. If the legislature does not appropriate money
- 23 specifically for that purpose, the board may, but is not required
- 24 to, implement a provision of this chapter.
- Sec. 2177.005. TRANSPARENT PHARMACY BENEFIT MANAGER. (a)
- 26 The board shall establish and implement a statewide transparent
- 27 pharmacy benefit manager to provide cost-effective prescription

- 1 drugs to entities and organizations served by the Initiative.
- 2 (b) The pharmacy benefit manager shall provide pricing
- 3 transparency, pass-through of all rebates and fees, and fair and
- 4 equitable pricing to any pharmacy that chooses to participate in
- 5 the pharmacy benefit manager's pharmacy network.
- 6 (c) The pharmacy benefit manager shall contract with
- 7 <u>appropriate entities to:</u>
- 8 <u>(1) provide evidence-based benefit design, prior</u>
- 9 authorization, and new drug review; and
- 10 (2) partner with suppliers, pharmaceutical
- 11 manufacturers, and group purchasing organizations for competitive
- 12 drug acquisition.
- 13 (d) The pharmacy benefit manager may charge fees for
- 14 startup, enrollment, and ongoing management to support operational
- 15 costs, program development, and expansion.
- 16 Sec. 2177.006. CENTRAL SERVICE CENTER AND SATELLITE
- 17 DISTRIBUTION FACILITIES. (a) The board shall establish and
- 18 implement a central service center and associated network of
- 19 satellite distribution facilities to provide pharmacy and medical
- 20 supplies in support of Texas public higher education systems and
- 21 <u>institutions</u>, the Employees Retirement System of Texas, the Teacher
- 22 Retirement System of Texas, the Texas Department of Criminal
- 23 Justice, the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, and other public,
- 24 non-profit, and for-profit entities. The center shall:
- 25 (1) be constructed to withstand severe weather,
- 26 natural disasters, and power outages, and shall be capable of
- 27 supporting disaster preparedness and relief statewide; and

- 1 (2) include a mail order pharmacy and specialty
- 2 pharmacy.
- 3 (b) The center <u>may assess a stock carrying charge</u>,
- 4 transaction fees, or other fees to support distribution and other
- 5 operational costs, including overhead and margin.
- 6 (c) The mail order and specialty pharmacy may receive
- 7 payment for dispensing prescription drugs and may assess
- 8 dispensing, delivery, and handling fees.
- 9 Sec. 2177.007 PHARMACEUTICAL ADVANCED PREPARATION
- 10 FACILITY. (a) The board shall establish a pharmaceutical advanced
- 11 preparation facility to provide Food and Drug Administration
- 12 approved 503B compounding, manufacturing, CAR-T and other gene
- 13 therapies, precision medicine, and advanced labs for quality
- 14 control, preparation and compounding in support of innovative
- 15 therapeutics and drug research.
- (b) The facility shall be operated by a 501 c(3) established
- 17 by the board.
- (c) The facility may charge fees for drug preparation,
- 19 manufacturing, CAR-T, gene therapy, and 503B compounding to support
- 20 operational costs, including overhead and margin.
- Sec. 2177.008 ADVANCED HEALTH CARE COST AND CLAIMS ANALYTIC
- 22 SERVICES. (a) The board shall contract to provide advanced health
- 23 care cost and claims analytic services to support the transparent
- 24 pharmacy benefit manager, mail order and specialty pharmacies,
- 25 central service center, and pharmaceutical advanced preparation
- 26 <u>facility established in this chapter</u>, and to support population
- 27 health and research.

- 1 Sec. 2177.009 GENERIC DRUG MANUFACTURING FACILITY. (a) The
- 2 board may enter into an agreement to establish a facility providing
- 3 for the manufacturing of generic drugs. In entering into an
- 4 agreement, the board shall prioritize savings and access to
- 5 affordable medications.
- 6 Sec. 2177.010 TEXAS PHARMACY INITIATIVE FUND. (a) The
- 7 Texas Pharmaceutical Initiative Fund is created as a trust fund
- 8 outside the treasury with the comptroller. The fund consists of
- 9 money from:
- 10 (1) gifts, grants, or donations to the executive
- 11 committee; and
- 12 (2) any other source appropriated or designated by the
- 13 legislature.
- 14 (b) The board may utilize the fund for the purpose of
- 15 carrying out this chapter.
- 16 <u>(c) The board shall develop procedures for administration</u>
- 17 and approval of expenditures through the fund.
- 18 Sec. 2177.011. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The board may
- 19 accept on behalf of the initiative gifts, grants, or donations from
- 20 any public or private source for the purpose of carrying out this
- 21 chapter.
- Sec. 2177.012. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than December 31 of
- 23 each year, the board shall submit to the Texas Legislature a written
- 24 report that outlines:
- 25 (1) the activities and objectives of the initiative;
- 26 (2) cost savings derived by state entities as a result
- 27 of participation in the initiative; and

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1 (3) any legislative recommendations.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by SECTION 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
