Section 802.107, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: 7 (d) Notwithstanding Sections 51.356 and 51.4012 and Chapter 8 9 53, the department may not deny issuance of a license to, refuse to renew the license of, or revoke or suspend a license held by a 10 person based on the person's arrest or conviction for an offense 11 involving the possession, manufacture, or delivery of a controlled 12 13 substance. 14 SECTION 2. Section 1603.401, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 15 Sec. 1603.401. DENIAL, SUSPENSION, OR REVOCATION. (a) The 16 department may deny an application for issuance or renewal of, or 17 may suspend or revoke, a license or permit if the applicant or 18 person holding the license or permit: 19 20 (1)engages in gross malpractice; 21 (2) knowingly continues to practice while having an infectious or contagious disease; 22 knowingly makes a false or deceptive statement in 23 (3) 24 advertising;

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1	(4) advertises, practices, or attempts to practice
2	under another person's name or trade name;
3	(5) engages in fraud or deceit in obtaining a license
4	or permit; or
5	(6) engages in an act that violates this chapter or
6	Chapter 51 or a rule or order adopted or issued under this chapter
7	or Chapter 51.
8	(b) Notwithstanding Sections 51.356 and 51.4012 and Chapter
9	53, the department may not deny an application for issuance or
10	renewal of, or suspend or revoke, a license or permit based on the
11	arrest or conviction of the applicant or license or permit holder
12	for an offense involving the possession, manufacture, or delivery
13	of a controlled substance.
14	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
