CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Proud members of the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe of

2 Texas are gathering in Austin for Alabama-Coushatta Day at the

3 State Capitol on February 7, 2023; and

WHEREAS, One of three federally recognized tribes in Texas,

5 the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe was originally two tribes, the Alibamus

6 and the Koasatis, who had a similar culture but lived in adjacent

7 lands in Alabama; starting in the 1760s, the two tribes began to

8 migrate westward into what is now East Texas; and

9 WHEREAS, In 1813, the tribes fought on the side of the

10 revolutionaries in the Mexican War of Independence from Spain, and

11 the new Mexican government granted them tracts of land in gratitude

12 for their service; two decades later, Sam Houston granted the

13 tribes land between the Neches and Sabine Rivers in exchange for not

14 siding with Mexico during the Texas Revolution; members of the

15 tribes served as guides for the Texan army and helped to feed

16 refugees who had fled from Santa Anna's troops; and

17 WHEREAS, Today, there are 1,200 members of the

18 Alabama-Coushatta, half of whom live on the reservation's 10,200

19 acres in the Big Thicket of East Texas; the tribe is a fully

20 functioning sovereign government, providing a full complement of

21 health and human services, and it is responsible for 250 jobs,

22 including teachers, doctors, and peace officers; members also

23 maintain a health clinic, a day-care center, a solid waste

24 facility, three churches, and retail shops; and

- 3 thousands of people who enjoy the fine opportunities for camping,
- 4 hiking, and picnicking; the reservation is also home to the Naskila
- 5 Gaming facility and an annual powwow and music festival; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Celebrating their rich heritage as they work to
- 7 build a better tomorrow, the people of the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe
- 8 may indeed take great pride in their unique contributions to the
- 9 history and culture of Texas; now, therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the 88th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 11 hereby recognize February 7, 2023, as Alabama-Coushatta Tribe of
- 12 Texas Day at the State Capitol and extend a warm welcome to the
- 13 visiting members of the tribe.
