HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Serving as an important prelude to the Texas 2 Revolution, the Battle of Velasco was fought from June 25 through 3 27, 1832, and the site of the engagement is being commemorated with the dedication of a memorial monument on June 27, 2023; and 4 5 WHEREAS, The conflict was perhaps the first incidence of bloodshed as resistance to Mexican rule intensified in Texas in the 6 7 1830s; the battle took place when a group of Texans under the command of Henry Smith and John Austin traveled to Brazoria to 8 secure a cannon to use against Mexican forces who had imprisoned 9 William Travis and others at Anahuac; when they tried to transport 10 11 the cannon down the Brazos River, they were opposed by a garrison of 12 Mexican soldiers led by Colonel Domingo de Ugartechea, commander of

Fort Velasco; and 13

14 WHEREAS, An estimated seven Texans and five Mexicans lost their lives in the fighting, with dozens more wounded on both sides; 15 16 ultimately, the Texans forced Colonel Ugartechea to surrender on June 29, after his troops exhausted their ammunition; and 17 WHEREAS, While records indicate that veterans of the Battle 18 of Velasco developed plans to erect a memorial for their fallen 19 20 comrades, no evidence for the existence of such a monument has ever 21 been found; recent imaging of the area has helped identify the exact
