20 WHEREAS, In all his endeavors, Mr. Aplin benefited from the 21 love and support of his partner, Mildred Hunt; he was the proud 22 father of five children, Beaver, Reginald, Wayne, Michele, and 23 Ollamae, and he experienced the joy of welcoming eight 24 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren into his family; in
