## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Human trafficking is an insidious crime that
- 2 exploits the most vulnerable members of society, robbing victims of
- 3 their freedom and dignity and weakening the very foundation of our
- 4 communities; and
- 5 WHEREAS, As defined by the Trafficking Victims Protection Act
- 6 of 2000, human trafficking primarily occurs in the form of sex or
- 7 labor trafficking, which may be compelled through the use of force,
- 8 threats, deception, or other means of coercion; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Although anyone can fall victim to this crime,
- 10 certain populations are at higher risk due to a lack of prevention
- 11 and services, including boys and young men, people who have been
- 12 affected by sexual violence or prior abuse, people experiencing
- 13 poverty, homelessness, or unstable living conditions, and
- 14 individuals who are systemically marginalized and underserved;
- 15 victims can be trafficked in person and online, in industries such
- 16 as food service and construction, and by both strangers and people
- 17 they know, including intimate partners, parents, and other family
- 18 members; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The keys to preventing human trafficking include
- 20 raising awareness and building resilience within our communities,
- 21 reducing social inequities, and addressing the social determinants
- 22 of health in underserved populations; and
- WHEREAS, Human trafficking requires a coordinated,
- 24 community-wide response, and one of the organizations working to

- 1 serve human trafficking victims in North Texas is Bob's House of
- 2 Hope in Argyle, which was founded by Robert "Bob" Williams in 2021;
- 3 Bob's House of Hope is the first safe house in the country dedicated
- 4 to adult male survivors of sex trafficking, and it endeavors to
- 5 provide person-centered, trauma-informed, and culturally and
- 6 linguistically appropriate care, along with other resources to help
- 7 these victims attain education and employment and rebuild their
- 8 lives; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Human trafficking is a violation of the fundamental
- 10 rights that are owed to every man, woman, and child, and the
- 11 observance of Human Trafficking Prevention Month calls on all of us
- 12 to affirm our commitment to preventing and responding to human
- 13 trafficking in our communities and to ensuring the safety,
- 14 security, and well-being of human trafficking survivors; now,
- 15 therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas
- 17 Legislature hereby recognize January 2023 as Human Trafficking
- 18 Prevention Month and encourage all Texans to learn more about human
- 19 trafficking and the ways they can help the victims of this terrible
