11 stepmothers, grandmothers, foster mothers, and female legal

12 guardians whose children are serving in the military or who have

13 achieved the status of veteran; and

14 WHEREAS, Today, at least 10 Texas chapters across the state are included in the more than 200 Blue Star Mothers of America 15 chapters that represent thousands of military families in the 16 United States; among their many contributions, BSMA members ship 17 care packages to military personnel who are deployed overseas, 18 assist veterans who experiencing homelessness, 19 are 20 hospitalized veterans, provide support for wounded military 21 members, and join together to honor those who have made the ultimate
