WHEREAS, The son of Charles and Dorothy Nell Brunjes of Waco,

5 Jim Brunjes was born on December 13, 1946, and he grew up with the

6 companionship of three siblings, Mickey, Jean, and Jane; he

7 attended Texas A&M University, where he earned a bachelor's degree

8 in mathematics and a master's degree in statistics; and

9 WHEREAS, Mr. Brunjes taught junior high before joining the

U.S. military and NASA to work on missile projects; he later held

11 leadership positions at multiple universities, including a tenure

12 with the internal audit department at Texas A&M, and he served for a

13 time as vice president of systems at Southwest Airlines; and

WHEREAS, In 1991, Mr. Brunjes joined Texas Tech University as

15 vice president for administration, and eight years later, he was

16 named vice chancellor and chief financial officer of the Texas Tech

17 University System; his responsibilities included overseeing the

18 system's nearly \$2 billion budget, managing numerous offices, and

19 serving as treasurer of the Texas Tech Foundation Board of

20 Directors; under his guidance, the system's endowment grew by

21 nearly \$750 million, and he also played an instrumental role in

22 establishing the Mentor Tech program and securing funding for

23 improvements to campus facilities; he retired in 2017, after two

24 and a half decades of distinguished service; and
