- 1 WHEREAS, Proud residents of Uvalde County are gathering in
- 2 Austin on March 1, 2023, to celebrate Uvalde County Day at the State
- 3 Capitol; and
- WHEREAS, Permanent settlers began to arrive in the region in
- 5 the 1850s, and Uvalde County was established in 1856; a
- 6 rough-and-tumble frontier area during and after the Civil War, the
- 7 county became a ranching center in the late 1800s and was also
- 8 renowned for its honey, which took first prize at the Paris World's
- 9 Fair in 1900; today, the county's economy continues to be based on
- 10 agribusiness, including farming and the raising of livestock such
- 11 as cattle, sheep, and goats; and
- WHEREAS, Four spring-fed rivers, the Nueces, Leona, Sabinal,
- 13 and Frio, have cut ruggedly beautiful canyons through the region's
- 14 rolling hills, and the county draws hunters from around the state
- 15 with its abundance of deer, quail, doves, and turkeys;
- 16 additionally, swimmers, campers, bird-watchers, and other outdoor
- 17 enthusiasts may enjoy the activities of the scenic Garner State
- 18 Park and Cooks Slough Sanctuary and Nature Park; and
- WHEREAS, Founded more than 150 years ago, the city of Uvalde
- 20 is the county seat and is home to a number of attractions; John
- 21 Nance "Cactus Jack" Garner, the 32nd vice president of the United
- 22 States, lived and practiced law there; former Texas governor Dolph
- 23 Briscoe Jr. was born and raised in the city and returned to it
- 24 following the completion of his terms in office; the Briscoe Art and

- 1 Antique Collection displays works collected by Governor Briscoe and
- 2 his wife; in addition, the town hosts presentations by the Sahawe
- 3 Indian Dancers, who help preserve the Native American cultural
- 4 practices of the Southwest with their popular performances; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Other communities in the county include Knippa,
- 6 Cline, Montell, Utopia, Concan, Reagan Wells, and Sabinal, which is
- 7 a popular ranch center and retirement area; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The citizens of this notable county are working to
- 9 preserve the best of their past even as they look forward to a
- 10 bright and promising future, and it is fitting to honor them for
- 11 their unique contributions to the story of the Lone Star State; now,
