WHEREAS, The son of Rufino and Elvira Lopez, Manuel Lopez was

born in San Diego, Texas, on January 1, 1938, and he was a member of

8 Park University; he also graduated from the Command and General

9 Staff College and was a faculty member there; and

WHEREAS, In 1957, Mr. Lopez enlisted in the U.S. Army, first

11 serving as a sergeant with the 69th Armor Regiment in Germany before

12 commanding a missile battery at Fort Carson; next, he commanded the

13 Headquarters Battery of the 2nd Target Acquisition Battalion in

14 Korea and served with the 82nd Airborne Division and the XVIII

15 Airborne Corps Operations Staff at Fort Bragg; and

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Lopez deployed to Vietnam in 1966 as an

17 airborne division battalion commander; subsequently, he rejoined

18 the XVIII Airborne Corps and was named airborne advisor for the

19 Argentine Army; in the 1970s, he went back to Korea as a fire

20 support coordinator, and in Texas, he became executive officer for

21 the 2nd Armored Division Artillery; he was later named chief of

22 staff of the Division Forward in Germany and then chief of the

23 Military Assistance Group in Argentina; his final active duty

24 assignment was with the Arkansas National Guard; he concluded his

- 2 included the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star, the Meritorious
- 3 Service Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, and the Air Medal;
- 4 after retiring from the military, he worked as a corporate
- 5 marketing manager for the Hallmark Electronics Firm; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Mr. Lopez shared a rewarding marriage with his wife,
- 7 the late Maria Rosario Lopez, and he took great pride in his 5
- 8 children, Camilla, Corina, Alma, Manuel, and Ana, as well as his 16
