## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Members of the Alzheimer's Association are
- 2 gathering at the Texas Capitol on April 5, 2023, as part of
- 3 Alzheimer's Association State Advocacy Day; and
- WHEREAS, A progressive neurodegenerative brain disorder,
- 5 Alzheimer's disease robs individuals of their memories and leads to
- 6 progressive mental and physical impairments; it is the
- 7 seventh-leading cause of death in the United States, and unlike the
- 8 other principal causes, there is currently no cure or treatment for
- 9 it and no way to slow its progression; in addition, Alzheimer's is
- 10 the most expensive disease in the U.S., costing more than cancer and
- 11 heart disease combined; and
- WHEREAS, Today, more than 6.7 million Americans are living
- 13 with Alzheimer's, including 400,000 in Texas; these individuals
- 14 require considerable assistance, and over 1 million Texans provide
- 15 home care to family and friends with Alzheimer's, for a total of
- 16 more than \$23.5 billion in unpaid labor; according to the National
- 17 Institute on Aging, Alzheimer's disease also indirectly costs
- 18 businesses more than \$37 billion a year in lost productivity as a
- 19 result of employees missing work or leaving their job to care for a
- 20 relative; and
- 21 WHEREAS, With early detection and diagnosis, individuals
- 22 with Alzheimer's and their families can better plan for the future
- 23 while gaining access to medications, critical research trials, and
- 24 support from the Alzheimer's Association; and

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- 1 WHEREAS, Alzheimer's Association State Advocacy Day provides
- 2 an important opportunity to raise awareness about Alzheimer's
- 3 disease, to honor caregivers who support and care for loved ones
- 4 with the disease, and to acknowledge the work of researchers who are
- 5 searching for a cause and a cure; now, therefore, be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas
- 7 Legislature hereby recognize April 5, 2023, as Alzheimer's
- 8 Association State Advocacy Day at the State Capitol and commend the
- 9 Alzheimer's Association for its efforts to fight this terrible
- 10 disease and to advocate for those suffering from it.
