for greater police accountability; she also served on the boards of 13

14 organizations such as Mothers for Clean Air and the Joint City County Commission on Children and Youth, in addition to hosting 15

16 news and public affairs talk shows on public radio; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Edwards made a successful bid for a seat on the 17 city council in 2001, and she represented District D for three 18 terms, from 2002 to 2008; over the course of her tenure, she chaired 19 council committees that addressed affordable housing, flooding 20 21 issues, and the HIV/AIDS epidemic; along the way, she demonstrated a keen ability to communicate with people from both sides of the 22 aisle and to earn the trust of residents who had historically been 23 underrepresented, which helped make her a champion for the Third
