## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Minority Cancer Awareness Month is being observed in 2 Texas in April to call attention to the disparities in cancer health 3 among racial and ethnic minority groups in the United States; and WHEREAS, Black, Native American, and Alaskan Native 4 5 communities experience the highest cancer rates and worst outcomes for each of the most common types of cancer; in addition, Black 6 7 communities are disproportionately impacted by other diseases, such as obesity, diabetes, and infections, making cancer treatment 8 9 more difficult and more likely to cause severe side effects; and WHEREAS, Cancer health disparities are worsened by some 10 11 socioeconomic conditions; people experiencing poverty are less 12 likely to enroll in clinical trials that offer improved cancer outcomes, and people with low income or insufficient health 13 14 insurance may lack access to medical specialists or genetic testing required by clinical trials; according to data from the U.S. Census 15 16 Bureau, Native American and Alaska Native, Black, Hispanic, and multiracial communities experienced the highest ratios of poverty 17 compared to total population in 2021; and 18 WHEREAS, Many people in racial minority groups die from 19 cancer due to a severe lack of matching stem cell or marrow donors 20 21 in the worldwide registry; in the United States, 75 percent of Black patients, 75 percent of multiracial patients, 55 percent of Latino 22 23 and Hispanic patients, and 60 percent of Asian American patients do not have a perfectly matched donor in the registry; and 24
