## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Residents of Panola County are gathering in Austin 2 on April 12, 2023, to celebrate Panola County Day at the State 3 Capitol; and

WHEREAS, Located in northeastern Texas and forming part of the state's border with Louisiana, Panola County covers more than 800 square miles of forests and rolling plains and is traversed by the Sabine River; the Texas Legislature officially created Panola County on March 30, 1846, and two years later, voters chose Carthage as the county seat; and

WHEREAS, It is believed that Judge John Allison, a prominent 10 civic leader, suggested the name Panola, which may be derived from 11 12 the Cherokee word for cotton, ponolo; the area's rich soil was well suited to the crop, and cotton became the county's main 13 14 agricultural product; today, Panola County enjoys a diversified economy, primarily based in oil and gas production, agriculture, 15 16 food processing, and timber; the lush forests also make the county a popular destination for hiking, birding, and camping enthusiasts, 17 while anglers enjoy the good fishing waters of Martin Creek Lake and 18 Lake Murvaul; and 19

20 WHEREAS, Panola County's rich heritage is recognized by 21 nearly 60 Texas Historical Commission markers; the county was the 22 birthplace of several notable Texans, including Margie Elizabeth 23 Neal, the first woman elected to serve in the Texas Senate, and 24 country music stars Tex Ritter and Jim Reeves; a museum dedicated to

1 Mr. Ritter and a memorial devoted to Mr. Reeves are located in 2 Carthage, as is the Texas Country Music Hall of Fame, which honors 3 the legacies of both of these men, along with other country music 4 legends from the state; and

5 WHEREAS, Named a National Main Street City in Texas, Carthage 6 is also home to Panola College and the historic Esquire Theater, 7 which hosts the Country Music Hayride live music show; other 8 popular events taking place in the county seat include the Piney 9 Woods Quilt Festival in April, the annual Classic Country Music 10 Festival Weekend in August, and Potlatch, an art, food, and music 11 festival that takes place in the fall; and

12 WHEREAS, The citizens of Panola County take great pride in 13 their rich history as they work together to build an even brighter 14 future, and it is indeed fitting to honor them for their unique 15 contributions to the Lone Star State; now, therefore, be it

16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas 17 Legislature hereby recognize April 12, 2023, as Panola County Day 18 at the State Capitol and extend a warm welcome to the visiting 19 delegation.
