R E S O L U T I O N

2 commissioner for the Harris County Commissioners Court in 2022; and

3 WHEREAS, First taking office in 2011, Jack Cagle was  
4 reelected in 2014 and 2018; over the course of his tenure, he

6 nearly 1.3 million residents and managing a staff of 445 employees;

11 holding leadership positions with the Texas Association of County

14 Council and the Public Power Pool, and he was a Republican precinct  
15 chair; he has received numerous honors for his accomplishments,  
16 including an award from the Mexican-American Bar Association of

19 economics, and managerial studies from Rice University and a doctor  
20 of jurisprudence degree from Baylor School of Law; in all his  
21 endeavors, he enjoys the love and support of his wife, Janet, and he  
22 takes great pride in their three children, Richard, Victoria, and  
23 Elizabeth; and

1 good governance, Jack Cagle has contributed immeasurably to Harris  
2 County, and he has earned the lasting respect and appreciation of
