1 WHEREAS, April 2023 has been recognized by presidential 2 proclamation as Second Chance Month to honor those who have

3 successfully reentered society after being incarcerated and to pay

4 tribute to the community groups, faith-based organizations, and

5 employers that are helping to reduce recidivism among former

6 inmates; and

7 WHEREAS, Individuals who have been incarcerated face

8 significant barriers in returning to life outside of a detention

9 facility; those who have successfully made that transition are

10 worthy of recognition, not only because of the challenges they have

11 overcome but also because of the positive example they provide to

12 others who are walking the same path; and

WHEREAS, The State of Texas is home to many men and women who

14 have transcended their troubled pasts to become productive

15 citizens; among their numbers are Cynthia Simons and Justin

16 Martinez, who have dedicated themselves to assisting formerly

17 incarcerated Texans in rebuilding their lives; and

18 WHEREAS, Since her release from prison, Cynthia Simons has

19 become a champion for incarcerated women and their families and has

20 made a significant difference through her efforts as a peer leader

21 and reentry specialist; she has served as a member of the

22 Austin/Travis County Reentry Roundtable and of the board of

23 MEASURE, a Black-led organization that works to promote data equity

24 to address community policing as well as health, education, and

- 2 Black people across the State of Texas, and she has played a pivotal
- 3 role in restoring parental rights to families torn apart by
- 4 incarceration; and
- 5 WHEREAS, After being incarcerated, Justin Martinez completed
- 6 his master's degree in legal studies with a paralegal
- 7 certification; he has since become a policy analyst, and through
- 8 his research and advocacy, he strives to dismantle systems of
- 9 oppression and to help Texans break the cycle of incarceration; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Many more individuals throughout our state have
- 11 likewise emerged from the criminal justice system to realize
- 12 meaningful goals in a broad range of endeavors, and their
- 13 experiences offer a moving testament to the human potential for
- 14 redemption; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas
- 16 Legislature hereby recognize April 2023 as Second Chance Month,
- 17 honor Cynthia Simons and Justin Martinez for their contributions as
- 18 activists for criminal justice reform and rehabilitation, and
- 19 commend those organizations and individuals who are assisting
- 20 former inmates in reintegrating into society.
