RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, In the early 1960s, leaders in the medical specialty 2 of anesthesiology recognized the existence of staffing shortages, and to meet growing demands and accommodate the increasing 3 complexity of anesthesia and surgery, a group of anesthesiologists 4 5 proposed the precursor to what is now the health care occupation of certified anesthesiologist assistant; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants are highly skilled health professionals who work under the direction of 8 9 licensed physician anesthesiologists to implement anesthesia care plans and work exclusively within the Anesthesia Care Team model, 10 11 as described by the American Society of Anesthesiologists; and 12 WHEREAS, All CAA students must have earned a baccalaureate degree with premedical coursework to be admitted into a CAA 13 14 training program and must complete a comprehensive didactic and clinical program at the graduate level; and 15 16 WHEREAS, CAA training programs must also include a minimum of 24 months in a master's level program accredited by the Commission 17 on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs and must be 18

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based at, or work in collaboration with, a university that has a

medical school and academic anesthesiologist physician faculty; as

part of their CAA training, students are typically required to

successfully complete an average of 600 hours of classroom and

laboratory education and 2,600 hours of clinical anesthesia

education; they are also required to administer a total of more than

- 1 600 anesthetics and to gain experience in all types of surgery; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants are trained
- 3 extensively in the delivery and maintenance of quality anesthesia
- 4 care as well as advanced patient monitoring techniques; they
- 5 perform tasks such as administering drugs, obtaining vascular
- 6 access, applying and interpreting monitors, establishing and
- 7 maintaining patient airways, and assisting with preoperative
- 8 assessment; and
- 9 WHEREAS, In 2010, Dr. Carin Hagberg, in her role as the chief
- 10 of anesthesiology for The University of Texas Health Science Center
- 11 at Houston, developed a partnership with Case Western Reserve
- 12 University to start a CAA program in Houston; it received initial
- 13 accreditation in 2010 from the Commission on Accreditation of
- 14 Allied Health Education Programs and the Accreditation Review
- 15 Committee for the Anesthesiologist Assistant; that same year, 16
- 16 graduate students were enrolled in the program, and they completed
- 17 their studies in 2012; and
- WHEREAS, In 2019, under the guidance of program director
- 19 Kenneth Maloney, CAA, the Case Western Reserve University
- 20 Anesthesiologist Assistant Program expanded to provide clinical
- 21 rotations in Central Texas at Baylor Scott and White Health in North
- 22 Austin; and
- WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants currently
- 24 provide anesthesia within an anesthesia care team at many major
- 25 hospitals in Texas, including the Heart Hospital of Austin, Baylor
- 26 Scott and White Health, Children's Medical Center Dallas, Methodist
- 27 Hospital, Memorial Hermann Orthopedic and Spine Hospital, Memorial

- 1 Hermann Southwest, Memorial Hermann The Woodlands, Memorial
- 2 Hermann Sugar Land, St. David's Hospital System in Austin, and
- 3 Texas Heart Institute at Baylor St. Luke's Medical Center; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants practice in
- 5 19 states, the District of Columbia, and the U.S. Territory of Guam;
- 6 they also practice within the Medicare system and provide
- 7 anesthesia services for a multitude of medical procedures every
- 8 year in the United States; they have practiced in Texas since 1997,
- 9 when Dr. John Zerwas of Greater Houston Anesthesiology brought them
- 10 into the practice to address the shortage in anesthesia providers;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, The Texas Academy of Anesthesiologist Assistants is
- 13 dedicated to the ethical advancement of the CAA profession and to
- 14 creating a better future through innovation, cutting-edge
- 15 medicine, advocacy, and education; the academy is ably led by
- 16 president Tasha Krueger, CAA, Tim Goodridge, CAA, and secretary
- 17 Thao Nguyen, CAA, as well as board members Frank Trzaska, CAA, Jana
- 18 McAllister, CAA, and Paul McHorse, CAA; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Certified anesthesiologist assistants have
- 20 dedicated their careers to serving the citizens of Texas, and they
- 21 are indeed deserving of special commendation; now, therefore, be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas
- 23 Legislature hereby recognize the week of February 20 through
- 24 February 24, 2023, as Certified Anesthesiologist Assistant Week in
- 25 Texas and encourage residents of the Lone Star State to pay tribute
- 26 to these invaluable professionals.
