RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The year 2023 marks the 48th anniversary of the fall

2 of South Vietnam and the subsequent emigration of hundreds of

3 thousands of Vietnamese refugees, many of whom settled in the

4 United States; and

5 WHEREAS, On April 30, 1975, North Vietnamese troops occupied

6 Saigon, bringing a final end to the Vietnam War, during which

7 American service personnel fought alongside South Vietnamese

8 troops to oppose the communist forces of North Vietnam and their

9 allies; during the course of the conflict, more than 58,000

10 American service members lost their lives and over 100,000 were

11 seriously wounded; losses among South Vietnamese forces are

12 estimated at a quarter of a million killed and perhaps as many badly

13 injured, and countless civilians perished; and

14 WHEREAS, American military involvement in the war ended with

15 the signing of the Paris Peace Accords in January 1973; a small

16 number of U.S. troops remained in South Vietnam to guard the

17 American Embassy in Saigon, but the last of those were withdrawn in

18 April 1975, as the North Vietnamese Army closed in on the city; in

19 the days before Saigon fell, more than 100,000 Vietnamese were

20 evacuated to the United States, including military personnel and

21 others whose previous associations made them targets of the Viet

22 Cong and North Vietnamese; and

23 WHEREAS, Over the ensuing decade, the Communists tightened

24 their grip on the country and hundreds of thousands more people

WHEREAS, Despite challenges, a multitude of Vietnamese 2 emigrants were able to establish new lives in other countries; 3 those settling in the United States were aided by the generous 4 5 efforts of the many Americans who extended a helping hand, and vibrant Vietnamese communities began to take root in cities across 6 the nation; by 2021, this population had reached approximately 1.9 7 8 million and constituted the fourth-largest Asian immigrant group in the nation; Texas is now home to almost 300,000 Vietnamese Americans, who have made substantial contributions to the economy, 10 education, public service, science, medicine, the arts, and many 11 12 other aspects of society; and

WHEREAS, The observance of this somber anniversary reminds us of the magnitude of the sacrifices made and hardships endured in the quest for freedom, and we pay tribute to those whose lives were lost and recognize the courage and determination of the Vietnamese people who came to these shores in search of a better life; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas 20 Legislature hereby commemorate the 48th anniversary of the fall of 21 South Vietnam at the conclusion of the Vietnam War.
