RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Association for Texas Advocates is celebrating 2 40 years of exemplary service to adults with intellectual and 3 developmental disabilities and their families in 2023; and

WHEREAS, Founded in 1983, Texas Advocates is a statewide self-advocacy organization run by and for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities; the nonprofit now has some 20 chapters and 500 members in towns and cities from the Rio Grande Valley to the Texas Panhandle and from El Paso to Texarkana; and

9 WHEREAS, Texas Advocates has steadfastly provided adult Texans with intellectual and developmental disabilities with a 10 11 range of programs to promote their well-being, connect them to their communities, and enrich their lives; the organization is 12 currently offering peer mentoring services at 13 residential 14 institutions, operating 15 Next Chapter Book Clubs to help participants discover the joy of reading, and preparing to train 40 15 of its members to become leaders in Texas organizations and 16 governmental entities by 2027; and 17

18 WHEREAS, Every year, Texas Advocates sponsors а well-attended annual conference for adults with intellectual and 19 20 developmental disabilities, their families, and organizations and 21 businesses that serve them, and this year, the conference will take place in the city of Denton; during each state legislative session, 22 23 the association sends representatives to discuss the needs of its clients and the cause of disability rights with state lawmakers, 24

4 WHEREAS, Texas Advocates is one of the few organizations of 5 its kind whose leadership structure includes an individual with an intellectual disability as its co-executive director, who works in 6 tandem with an experienced nonprofit executive; its current 7 8 co-executive directors are Brooke Hohfeld and Deborah Wallace, who are doing an exemplary job of leading the organization with the 9 support of the Texas Council for Developmental Disabilities, the 10 Tocker Foundation, and other donors; and 11

WHEREAS, For four decades, the Association for Texas Advocates has supported and empowered countless clients across the state through its initiatives and advocacy efforts, and it is a pleasure to join in recognizing the organization on this special milestone in its history; now, therefore, be it
