1 WHEREAS, Patrick Bresette retired as executive director of 2 Children's Defense Fund-Texas in April 2023, drawing to a close an exemplary career in public policy spanning more than three decades; 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, Appointed executive director in 2014, Mr. Bresette was instrumental in securing millions of dollars in dedicated 6 7 funding to support the organization's mission; he built a strong team by fostering a culture of compassion and care, enabling staff 8 members to make a significant positive impact even during 9 exceptionally challenging times; under his leadership, the Texas 10 11 office expanded direct child health outreach and enrollment, and it 12 increased advocacy and organizing efforts in behalf of the uninsured; moreover, it developed a new youth civic education and 13 14 engagement initiative and served as a voice for immigrant children and families; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Mr. Bresette previously served as executive director of Public Works, a nonprofit organization committed to 17 promoting greater understanding and appreciation of the vital role 18 of the public sector and civic responsibility; he traveled 19 20 nationally to help leaders and activists around the country make a 21 compelling case for public systems and structures at the local, state, and federal levels; from 1991 to 2004, he served as associate 22

where he launched the Texas Kids Count Initiative and guided the

- 4 legislative priorities, and he testified before state house and
- 5 senate committees and administrative hearings; he has been much in

- WHEREAS, A Washington, D.C., native, Mr. Bresette earned a
- 8 bachelor's degree in fine arts in sculpture from the New York State
- 9 College of Ceramics at Alfred University; he went on to complete a
- 10 master's degree at The University of Texas at Austin LBJ School of
- 11 Public Affairs; his retirement will afford him more time to spend
- 12 with his treasured family and to pursue such interests as
- 13 carpentry, design, neon art and sculpture, cooking, barbecuing, and
- 14 gardening; and
- WHEREAS, Patrick Bresette devoted his career to creating
- 16 positive social change and improving the lives of children and
- 17 families, and as he embarks on the next exciting chapter of his
- 18 life, he may indeed reflect with pride on his contributions; now,
- 19 therefore, be it

- 21 Legislature hereby congratulate Patrick Bresette on his retirement
- 22 as executive director of Children's Defense Fund-Texas and extend
