## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Furthering their remarkable legacy of gridiron 2 excellence, the Carthage High School football team closed out an 3 unforgettable year by winning the 2022 University Interscholastic 4 League 4A Division 2 state championship; and

5 WHEREAS, The Bulldogs began their journey to the title with undefeated regular-season run that yielded the district 6 an 7 championship; continuing to excel in the playoffs, they bested Pittsburg, Van Alstyne, Gilmer, and Texarkana Pleasant Grove High 8 9 Schools to reach the state semifinals; in that contest, Carthage clinched a thrilling 42-35 decision over Glen Rose High by scoring a 10 touchdown with only eight seconds remaining; with the win, the team 11 12 punched its ticket to the state championship game for the 10th time 13 in school history; and

14 WHEREAS, On December 16, top-ranked Carthage battled No. 6 Wimberley High School for the state crown at AT&T Stadium in 15 16 Arlington; delivering impressive performances on both sides of the ball, the Bulldogs capitalized on forced turnovers and controlled 17 the line of scrimmage, building an insurmountable 35-0 halftime 18 lead and going on to triumph by the final score of 42-0; with the 19 20 victory, Carthage collected its ninth state title, adding to its championships won in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2013, 2016, 2017, 2019, and 21 2020, and ended the season with a perfect 16-0 record; and 22

23 WHEREAS, Carthage was led in the title game by Connor Cuff and 24 Jakerrian Roquemore, the game's respective Offensive and Defensive

1 Most Valuable Players, and by Noah Paddie, who tied a 4A state final 2 record with 191 receiving yards; the Bulldogs also received 3 valuable contributions throughout the year from each member of the 4 roster, and these talented student-athletes were ably guided by 5 head coach Scott Surratt, who secured his ninth title in 15 years at 6 the helm of the Carthage football program; and

7 WHEREAS, By accomplishing the rare feat of winning a ninth 8 state championship, the Carthage Bulldogs have burnished their 9 school's reputation as a gridiron powerhouse, and memories of this 10 exceptional achievement will resonate with their fellow students 11 and their many supporters in the local community for years to come; 12 now, therefore, be it
