2 commissioner for Precinct 4 in January 2023; and

4 draws on a wealth of valuable experience; he began his career in
5 public service as an appointee in the Obama administration, where
6 he focused on college access issues and addressing harassment in
7 schools; following his return from Washington, D.C., he was a
8 district leader in the Fort Bend Independent School District;
9 furthermore, he served as a board member on the Gulf Coast Workforce
10 Board-Workforce Solutions, and he later worked as chief of staff to
11 the Fort Bend County Judge, during which time he successfully
12 fought for a nonprofit grant program and created an \$11 million
13 public-private partnership to address key priorities, such as
14 expanding Internet access; and

16 Mr. McCoy holds a bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism and
17 political science from Boston University; in all of his endeavors,
18 he enjoys the love and support of his wife, Chelsea, and their
19 daughter, Piper; and

21 able and dedicated efforts of our public servants, and Dexter
22 McCoy's skills and experience are sure to serve him well in his new
23 role; now, therefore, be it
