1 WHEREAS, Each year, Texans join in celebrating the Fourth of
2 July in honor of the day America's founding fathers adopted one of
3 the landmark documents of modern history, the Declaration of
4 Independence; and

5 WHEREAS, Independence Day gatherings are a beloved American
6 tradition, one that brings together citizens of many different
7 backgrounds and that fosters a welcome sense of community; at such
8 times, the Stars and Stripes waves proudly as individuals across
9 the country pause to reflect on the ideals that undergird the great

13 not been secured without tremendous cost; from the colonial
14 militias who skirmished with muskets to the brave men and women who
