1 WHEREAS, Memories of a life filled with joyful times and 2 meaningful accomplishments remain to comfort the family and friends of Johnny Welton Self, who passed away on December 21, 2022, at the 3 age of 72; and 4 5 WHEREAS, The son of Helen Self Hickman and Jonas Banks, John Self was born in Zachary, Louisiana, on January 29, 1950, and grew 6 7 up in a family that included his siblings, Clarence, Billy, Barbara, and Ernest; he graduated from Chaneyville High School and 8 earned his bachelor's degree from the School of Business Management 9 at Southern University; on June 23, 1973, he married his soulmate 10 11 and best friend, the former Beatrice "Bea" Tapps, and they were 12 blessed with two children, Jeremy and Jarita; their treasured family later grew to include three grandchildren, Tristan, Tatum, 13 14 and Troy Johnny; and WHEREAS, In 1973, Mr. Self became the City of Arlington's 15 16 first Black firefighter; he later joined the office of the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts before embarking on a noteworthy 17 career with TXU Energy/Oncor; there, he blazed another trail, 18 becoming the company's first male African American vice president; 19 20 during his many years representing TXU/Oncor at the State Capitol, 21 his warmth, charm, and expertise earned him the admiration and friendship of many; following his retirement in 2008, he continued 22 23 to work as a political consultant, maintaining close ties with his numerous acquaintances in Austin; and 24
