13 family later grew to include three grandchildren, Tristan, Tatum,

14 and Troy Johnny; and WHEREAS, In 1973, Mr. Self became the City of Arlington's 15 16 first Black firefighter; he later joined the office of the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts before embarking on a noteworthy 17 career with TXU Energy/Oncor; there, he blazed another trail, 18 becoming the company's first male African American vice president; 19 20 during his many years representing TXU/Oncor at the State Capitol, 21 his warmth, charm, and expertise earned him the admiration and friendship of many; following his retirement in 2008, he continued 22 23 to work as a political consultant, maintaining close ties with his
