## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Honorable Eddie Bernice Johnson of Dallas
retired as dean of the Texas congressional delegation in January
concluding a noteworthy tenure spanning 15 terms in office;
and
WHEREAS, Admired as a trailblazer, Representative Johnson
became the first Black woman ever elected to public office in Dallas
when she won a seat in the Texas House in 1972; twenty years later,

9 in Congress; she became the first Black woman to chair the House

she earned distinction as the first registered nurse ever to serve

10 Science, Safety, and Technology Committee in 2019; and

WHEREAS, Representative Johnson was an ardent champion of STEM education for girls and minority students, and she helped secure passage of the CHIPS and Sciences Act to increase production of semiconductor chips in the United States; moreover, she played an important role in the development of The University of Texas Arlington and Dallas campuses as Tier One Research facilities; and

17 WHEREAS, Benefiting transportation and the economy in North
18 Texas, Representative Johnson was instrumental in passage of the
19 law repealing the Wright Amendment, which had imposed flight
20 restrictions on Dallas Love Field; throughout her tenure, she
21 worked tirelessly to bring federal funding for Dallas Area Rapid
22 Transit; her efforts also proved key in legislation that helped
23 enable construction of AT&T Stadium in Arlington; she excelled in

forging positive relationships across the aisle to achieve results

- 1 for her constituents; and
- WHEREAS, Representative Johnson was born in Waco in 1935, and
- 3 after graduating from A. J. Moore High School, she earned her
- 4 nursing certificate from St. Mary's College at the University of
- 5 Notre Dame; she went on to receive a bachelor's degree from Texas
- 6 Christian University and a master of public administration degree
- 7 from Southern Methodist University; while employed by the Veterans
- 8 Administration hospital in Dallas, she was a psychotherapist and
- 9 chief psychiatric nurse; following three terms in the Texas House,
- 10 she served as an administrator for the United States Department of
- 11 Health, Education, and Welfare; she then became a business owner
- 12 and served in the Texas Senate from 1987 to 1993; and
- WHEREAS, Over the course of her long and distinguished career
- 14 in public service, Eddie Bernice Johnson demonstrated a deep
- 15 understanding of the needs of her constituents and an unyielding
- 16 commitment to building a brighter future for all Americans; now,
- 17 therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas
- 19 Legislature hereby honor Eddie Bernice Johnson for her exemplary
- 20 service as a United States congresswoman and extend to her sincere
- 21 best wishes for the future; and, be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 23 prepared for Representative Johnson as an expression of high regard
- 24 by the Texas House of Representatives.
