RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Fans the world over are mourning the loss of music 2 superstar Tina Turner, who passed away on May 24, 2023, at the age 3 of 83; and WHEREAS, Born Anna Mae Bullock on November 26, 1939, she grew 4 up in rural Nutbush, Tennessee, and nearby areas and later moved to 5 St. Louis, Missouri; there, she met R&B bandleader Ike Turner and 6 7 began singing with his group, the Kings of Rhythm, as a teenager; when the group's main vocalist missed a recording session, she took 8 the lead on "A Fool in Love," and the song reached No. 2 on the 9 Billboard R&B chart; Mr. Turner gave her the catchier stage name of 10 11 Tina, and they married in 1962; her powerful, richly textured voice 12 fueled a number of R&B hits, while her frenetic dancing and volcanic charisma made the act a big draw at "chitlin' circuit" venues across 13 14 the country; the Ike and Tina Turner Revue kept up a relentless schedule, and tours with the Rolling Stones in 1966 and 1969 15 introduced them to a wider audience in Britain as well as the U.S.; 16 17 and WHEREAS, In 1966, Ms. Turner recorded the future classic 18 "River Deep, Mountain High" with legendary rock producer Phil 19 20 Spector and began to recognize she was an artist in her own right; 21 the Ike and Tina Turner Revue scored its biggest hit in 1971 with a 22 cover of the Credence Clearwater Revival song "Proud Mary," but Ike 23 Turner's abusive behavior and drug addiction exacted a toll

personally and professionally; Ms. Turner fled the marriage in 1976

- 1 and, for a time, was forced to live with friends in exchange for
- 2 cleaning their houses; determined to make a comeback, she toured
- 3 again with the Rolling Stones in 1981 and scored her first solo hit
- 4 with a cover of Al Green's "Let's Stay Together"; she was appearing
- 5 at a New York City nightclub two years later when David Bowie came
- 6 to see her, Capitol Records executives in tow, and they signed her
- 7 to a contract; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Ms. Turner's 1984 album Private Dancer became a
- 9 massive hit, yielding the No. 1 single "What's Love Got to Do With
- 10 It"; finally achieving international stardom in her mid-40s, she
- 11 remained one of the world's top concert draws for the next 25 years
- 12 and sold over 100 million records; she took on acting roles as well
- 13 and played a central part in the movie Mad Max Beyond Thunderdome,
- 14 for which she sang the soundtrack hit, "We Don't Need Another Hero
- 15 (Thunderdome)"; her 1986 memoir inspired the Oscar-nominated movie
- 16 What's Love Got to Do With It; in addition, she and her husband
- 17 Erwin Bach were executive producers of a Broadway hit based on her
- 18 life, Tina: The Tina Turner Musical; in 2005, she received a Kennedy
- 19 Center Honor, and she was inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame
- 20 twice, as both a member of the revue and a solo artist; she retired
- 21 from the stage in 2009; and
- 22 WHEREAS, A mesmerizing performer with a peerless voice, Tina
- 23 Turner inspired countless people with her indomitable spirit as
- 24 well as her immense talent, and her legacy will continue to resonate
- 25 in the years to come; now, therefore, be it
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 88th Texas
- 27 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Tina Turner and extend

- 1 sincere condolences to all who mourn her passing; and, be it further
- 2 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
- 3 prepared for her family and that when the Texas House of
- 4 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Tina
- 5 Turner.
