1 WHEREAS, A life made rich through meaningful service drew to 2 a close with the death of the Reverend Monsignor Patrick Roland 3 Wells of Houston on May 11, 2023, at the age of 92; and WHEREAS, The son of Luther and Stella Wells, Patrick Wells 4 5 was born in Ames, Texas, on April 1, 1931; he served in the U.S. Air Force, rising to the rank of staff sergeant, and went on to pursue 6 7 an academic career; after completing a doctorate in pharmaceutical science at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, he taught at Fordham 8 9 University and became the first Black faculty member at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's School of Pharmacy; he then served 10 11 with distinction for many years as dean of the College of Pharmacy 12 at Texas Southern University, and he was the editor of the Journal of the National Pharmaceutical Association and active in a number 13 14 of professional organizations; and WHEREAS, Following his retirement from TSU in 1990, Monsignor 15 16 Wells earned a master of divinity degree from Sacred Heart School of Theology in Wisconsin; he was ordained as a priest in 1993 and 17 served from then until 2006 as pastor of St. Francis of Assisi 18
