## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 87, Local Government Code,
- 6 is amended by adding Section 87.0135 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 87.0135. OFFICIAL MISCONDUCT GROUNDS: POLICY OF
- 8 NONENFORCEMENT OF CRIMINAL OFFENSES. (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "Policy" includes a formal, written rule or policy
- 10 and an informal, unwritten policy.
- 11 (2) "Prosecuting attorney" means a district attorney
- 12 or a county attorney with criminal jurisdiction.
- 13 <u>(b) A prosecuting attorney may not:</u>
- 14 (1) adopt or enforce a policy under which the
- 15 prosecuting attorney prohibits or materially limits the
- 16 enforcement of any criminal offense; or
- 17 (2) as demonstrated by pattern or practice, prohibit
- 18 or materially limit the enforcement of any criminal offense.
- (c) In compliance with Subsection (b), a prosecuting
- 20 attorney may not prohibit or materially limit a peace officer or
- 21 attorney who is employed by or otherwise under the direction or
- 22 control of the prosecuting attorney from enforcing any criminal
- 23 offense.
- 24 (d) A prosecuting attorney who violates this section

- 1 commits official misconduct for purposes of removal under this
- 2 <u>subchapter.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
