5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 10, Business & Commerce Code,
6	is amended by adding Chapter 328 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 328. ONLINE SALE OF GOODS
8	Sec. 328.001. PROHIBITIONS CONCERNING SALE OF GOODS ONLINE.
9	(a) For commercial purposes, a person may not sell, use, or cause
10	to be used any technology, device, or software in the sale of a good
11	on an Internet website that:
12	(1) functions as a bypass in the purchasing process;
13	(2) disguises the identity of the purchaser;
14	(3) permits the purchase of a quantity of goods in a
15	number that exceeds the maximum number of goods that may be sold to
16	one purchaser as specified by the seller or operator on the website;
17	(4) allows for the unauthorized access to or
18	identification of gift card information, including gift card
19	numbers and gift card personal identification numbers; or
20	(5) circumvents a security measure, access control
21	system, or other control, authorization, or measure in the
22	purchasing process.
23	(b) This section does not apply to the seller of the good or

the Internet website or to the operator of the Internet website.

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- 1 Sec. 328.002. ENFORCEMENT BY ATTORNEY GENERAL; INJUNCTION.
- 2 (a) The attorney general may investigate a claim that a person
- 3 <u>violated this chapter.</u>
- 4 (b) If the attorney general believes that a person is
- 5 violating this chapter, the attorney general may bring an action in
- 6 the name of the state to restrain or enjoin the person from
- 7 violating this chapter.
- 8 (c) The attorney general is entitled to recover all
- 9 reasonable costs of bringing an action under this section,
- 10 including court costs, reasonable attorney's fees, and
- 11 investigation costs.
- 12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
