1-21 relating to prohibitions in connection with the online sale of
 1-22 goods.

1-23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-24 SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 10, Business & Commerce Code,
 1-25 is amended by adding Chapter 328 to read as follows:

1-26 CHAPTER 328. ONLINE SALE OF GOODS

1-27 Sec. 328.001. PROHIBITIONS CONCERNING SALE OF GOODS ONLINE.

1-28 (a) For commercial purposes, a person may not sell, use, or cause
 1-29 to be used any technology, device, or software in the sale of a good
 1-30 on an Internet website that:

1-31 (1) functions as a bypass in the purchasing process;

1-32 (2) disguises the identity of the purchaser;

1-33 (3) permits the purchase of a quantity of goods in a
 1-34 number that exceeds the maximum number of goods that may be sold to
 1-35 one purchaser as specified by the seller or operator on the website;

1-36 (4) allows for the unauthorized access to or
 1-37 identification of gift card information, including gift card
 1-38 numbers and gift card personal identification numbers; or

1-39 (5) circumvents a security measure, access control
 1-40 system, or other control, authorization, or measure in the
 1-41 purchasing process.

1-42 (b) This section does not apply to the seller of the good on
 1-43 the Internet website or to the operator of the Internet website.

1-44 Sec. 328.002. ENFORCEMENT BY ATTORNEY GENERAL; INJUNCTION.

1-45 (a) The attorney general may investigate a claim that a person
 1-46 violated this chapter.

1-47 (b) If the attorney general believes that a person is
 1-48 violating this chapter, the attorney general may bring an action in
 1-49 the name of the state to restrain or enjoin the person from
 1-50 violating this chapter.

1-51 (c) The attorney general is entitled to recover all
 1-52 reasonable costs of bringing an action under this section,
 1-53 including court costs, reasonable attorney's fees, and
 1-54 investigation costs.

1-55 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2023.
